ORDINANCE No. 184350

* Authorize a \$285,000 grant agreement a with Janus Youth Programs, Inc. to fund shelter beds and treatment for juvenile human trafficking victims and two additional victim advocate positions for a one year period (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1: The Council finds:

- 1. City Council Resolution #36824, approved by City Council on November 10, 2010, recognized the following conditions creating a need for funding to be allocated by Grant Agreement.
- 2. A \$500,000 federal grant, Multnomah County has established a multi agency task force, the Commercially Sexual Exploitation of Children Steering Committee (CSEC), so community partners can collaborate and create a coordinated community response to the juvenile human trafficking and create an action plan.
- 3. Currently, there are no dedicated shelter beds available for juvenile human trafficking victims in the Portland metro area.
- 4. The Sexual Abuse Resource Center (SARC) provides extensive support to juvenile human trafficking victims through a 24-how crisis line, hospital visits, case management, prevention education and outreach, offering support groups, and providing free mental health services.
- 5. The City of Portland and Multnomah County have joined together to fund shelter beds and treatment for juvenile human trafficking victims at a Janus Youth Programs Inc. facility in the City of Portland.
- 6. In order to provide a safe place for juvenile human trafficking victims, provide essential treatment services and fund additional SARC victim advocates, an additional \$285,000.00 in funding is necessary.
- 7. Janus Youth Programs Inc. will serve as the lead fiscal agent within the terms of a grant agreement working in consortium with SARC to provide the listed worker positions and services.
- 8. It is imperative to act now between budget cycles because the juvenile human trafficking problem requires immediate action;
- 9. It is necessary to provide these funds on an emergency basis.
- 10. The amount of this grant is not to exceed \$285,000.00.

11. The Grant Agreement duration shall be in effective retroactively from November I, 2010 and continues through October 31, 2011. The Grant Manager is authorized to renew this grant in the same or different amount, provided that sufficient funds are appropriated by City Council and included within the City's approved budget for fiscal years 2010-2011 and 2011-2012.

NOW, THEREFORE the Council directs:

- a. The City of Portland designates and authorizes the funding contained in this ordinance to be a grant. The Office of the Mayor is authorized, on behalf of the City, to enter into a Grant Agreement with Janus Youth Programs Inc., as substantially set forth in Exhibit A attached to this ordinance. The Grant Manager is authorized to amend and renew the Grant Agreement in accordance with the Grant Agreement.
- b. The funds will come from the special appropriation created by City Council Resolution #36824 to be administered by the Office of Mayor Sam Adams, representing the interests of the City Council.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are authorized to draw and deliver checks totaling \$285,000.00 to Janus Youth, chargeable to the FY 2010-11 General Fund budget.

Section 2: The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay will jeopardize the timely execution of the award of the Grant Agreement to the Janus Youth Program, Inc., which may impact the Janus Youth Program's ability to deliver services required under this Grant; therefore, this Ordinance is in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
