

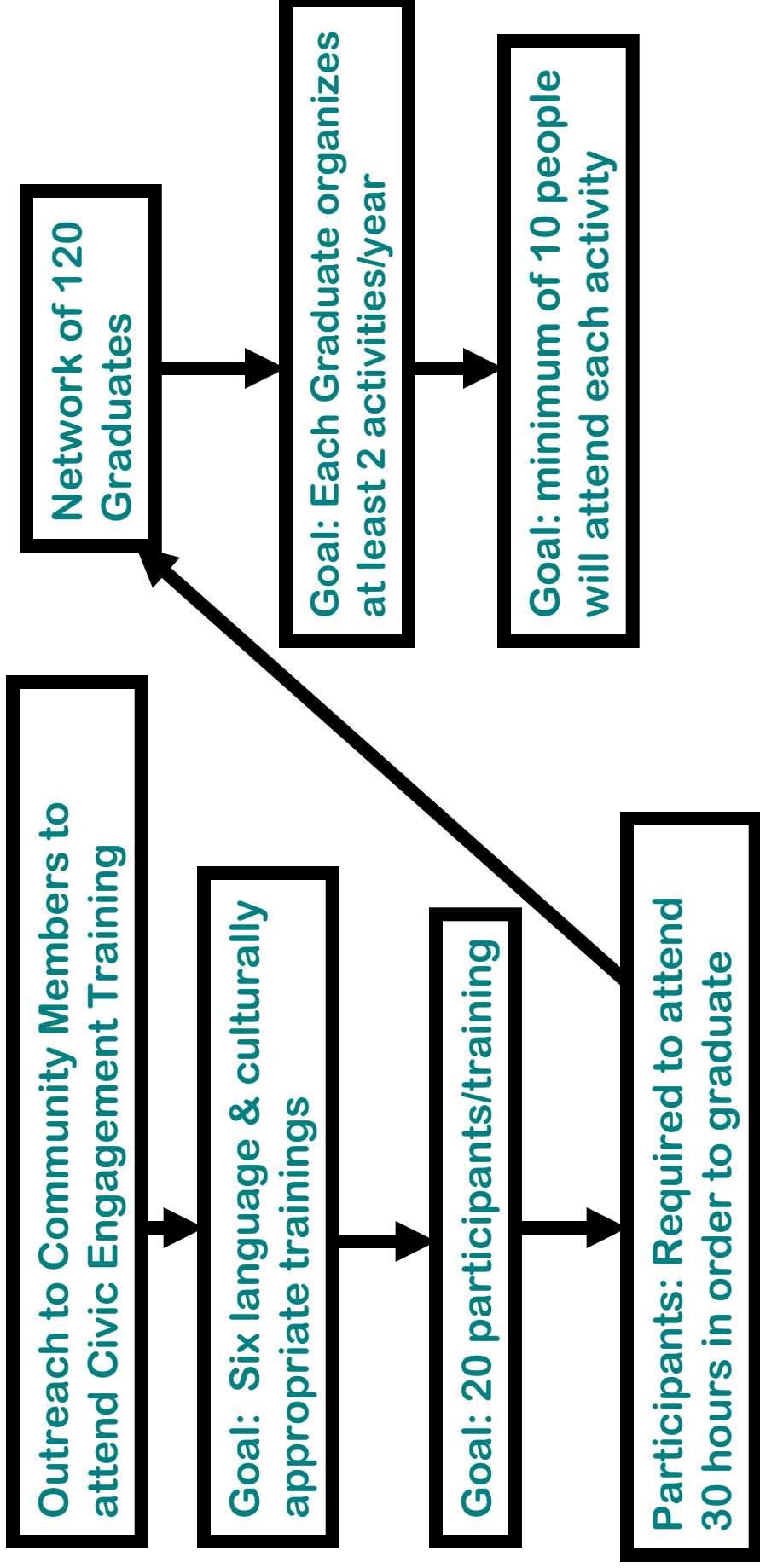

Our mission is to bring the voice of youth into the advocacy process, while advocating for East Portland's fair share of resources and support for our young people, schools, and providers.



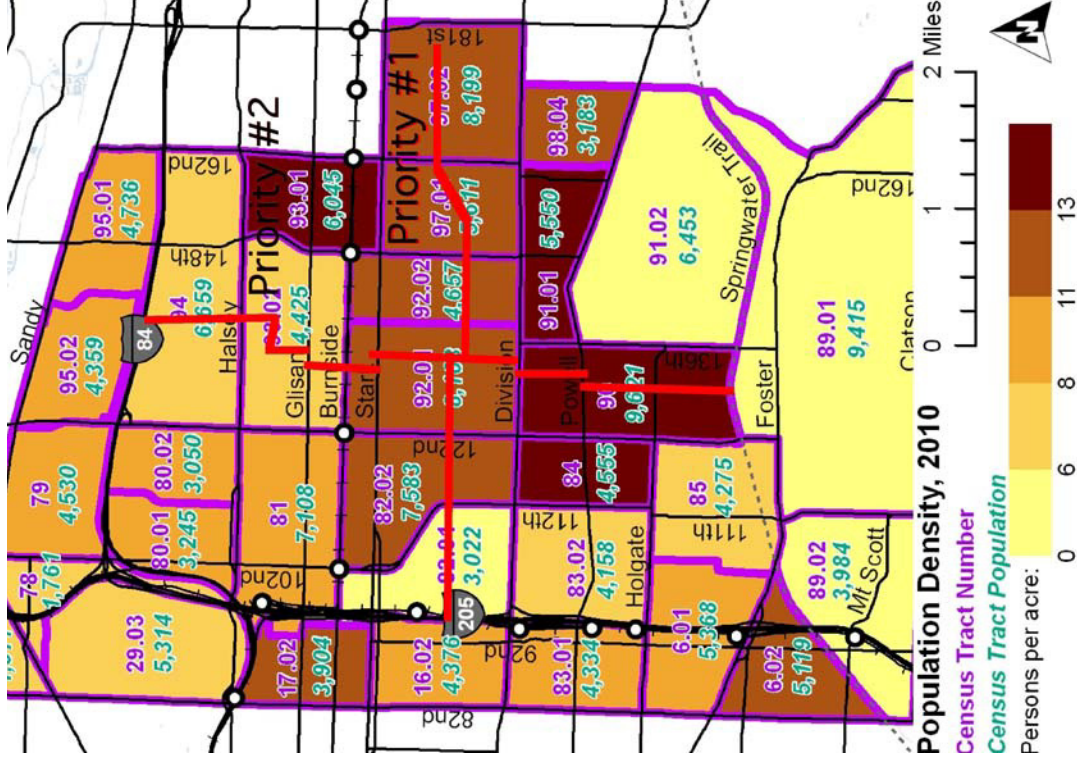
MAXaction Subcommittee

2009 - 11 Grant Award Summary

- Sixty eight grant applications in three rounds
 - Total requested funds of \$353,882
 - Funded 28% of requests
- Thirty five applications selected
 - Funding total \$100,000
 - Total of leveraged funds \$696,282

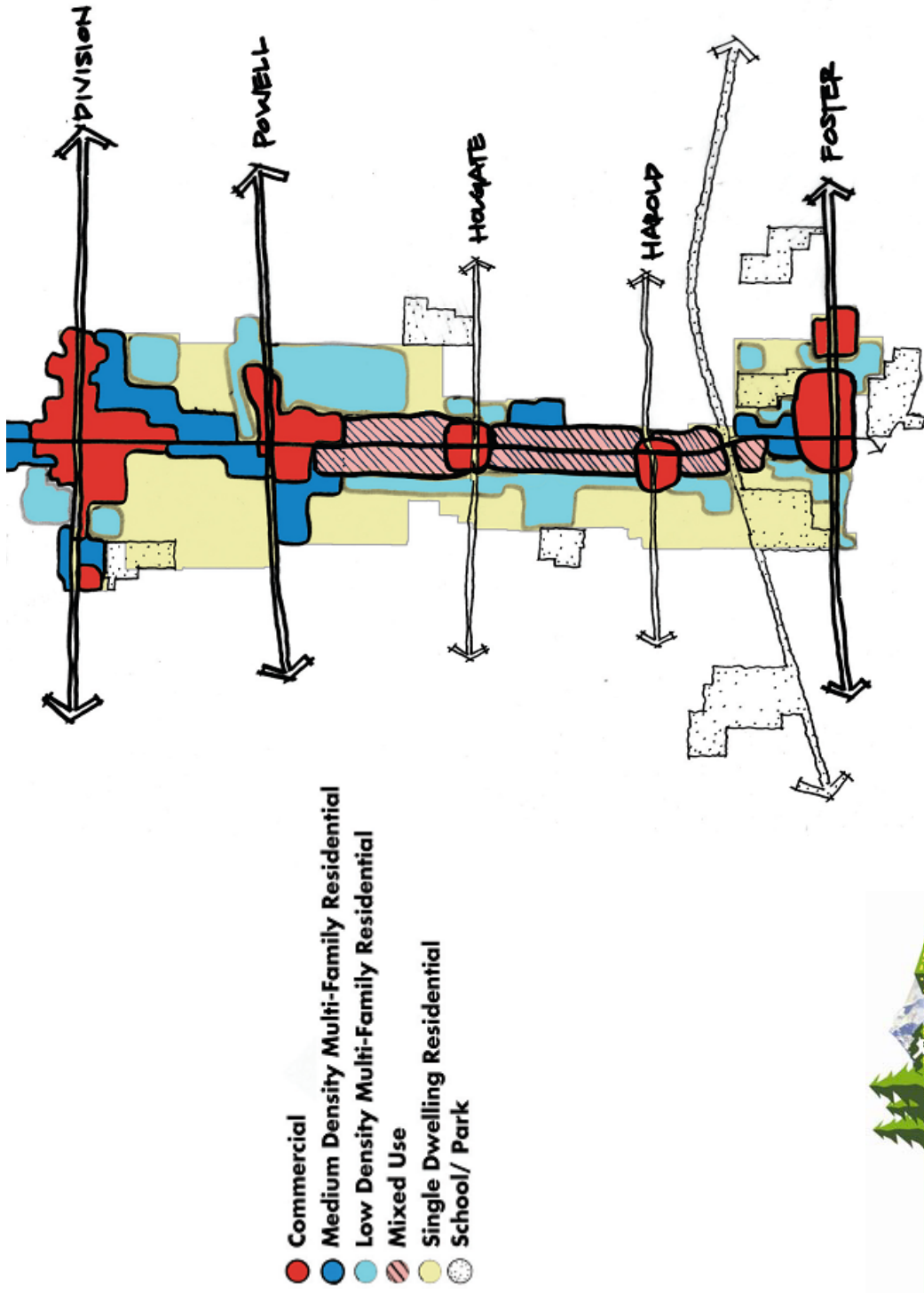
