5. History of Agenda Item/Background: Title 29 contains the Property Maintenance Regulations for Cleanliness and Sanitation. This section currently requires owners of rental property to subscribe to and pay for garbage service on a weekly basis. This section also requires owner occupied properties that have been posted two or more times within one year for violation of Section 29.20.010H (1) or (2) to subscribe to and pay for weekly garbage collection.

On August 17, 2011, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 18421 adopting rates for solid waste, recycling and composting collection. This rate schedule eliminates weekly garbage collection and adds weekly collection of yard debris and food scraps. Garbage collection will occur on an every other week schedule.



Non-Emergency Item

**Purpose of Agenda Item:** The amendments to Title 29 Property Maintenance Regulations 29.30.140 Cleanliness and Sanitation are needed to ensure consistency throughout City Code. Owners of residential rental properties and property owners posted two or more times for violation of Section 29.20.010H(1) or (2) will be required to subscribe to every-other-week curbside garbage service rather than weekly garbage service, which will no longer be offered.
