The desire to make the services AmeriCorps members provide to the community available beyond the current fiscal year resulted in the ordinance authorizing BES to sponsor AmeriCorps members for three years, provided funding is available. Continuing to sponsor AmeriCorps members will help the bureau and the city work much more closely with underserved Portlanders to help address their needs.

I. RECOMMENDATION Pass the ordinance as written.

II. BACKGROUND

BES has partnered with the Northwest Service Academy (NWSA) since 1999 to sponsor AmeriCorps members. In 2010, NWSA's local chapter did not receive federal funding, so they were unable to provide AmeriCorps members to BES. In 2011, former NWSA staff formed the Confluence Environmental Center (CEC) in partnership with fiscal agent Palouse-Clearwater Environmental Institute. Beginning in September 2011, CEC will work with BES to provide AmeriCorps members for work addressing critical environmental and equity issues in the areas of healthy watersheds, energy and resource conservation, and environmental education and outreach.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The maximum annual amount that may be spent on AmeriCorps members under this ordinance is \$50,000. For FY12, \$14,000 is budgeted in the BES Sewer System Operating Fund (ESWS000007) for one AmeriCorps member. Additional funding will be requested as needed in future budgeting processes.
