7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS During Fiscal Year 2009-2010, BDS was forced to layoff more than one hundred fifty (150) employees due to a precipitous decline in fee and permit revenue that funds the Bureau's work. Post-layoffs, Hank McDonald, former Commercial Inspection Division Manager and current IT Advancement Project Manager, has been performing Chief Plumbing Inspector duties, because he holds a Commercial Plumbing Inspection certification. However, when Mr. McDonald is out of the office, the Bureau does not have a Chief Plumbing Inspector available. The City has determined that Senior Electrical Inspectors and Senior Plumbing Inspectors will perform the duties of Chief Inspector when Mr. McDonald is not available. The City will pay Senior Electrical Inspectors and Senior Plumbing Inspectors a premium of \$1.16 per hour for all hours worked when they are assigned Chief Inspector duties, because of the higher level of technical knowledge and skill required to perform the Chief Inspector duties.

ORDINANCE No.

*Ratify the implementation of the Bureau of Development Services Chief Inspector premium pay for Senior Electrical Inspector and Senior Plumbing Inspector employees who perform the duties of the Chief Plumbing Inspector (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. During Fiscal Year 2009-2010, BDS was forced to layoff more than one hundred fifty (150) employees due to a precipitous decline in fee and permit revenue that funds the Bureau's work.
- 2. Post-layoffs, Hank McDonald, former Commercial Inspection Division Manager and current IT Advancement Project Manager, has been performing Chief Plumbing Inspector duties, because he holds a Commercial Plumbing Inspection certification. However, when Mr. McDonald is out of the office, the Bureau does not have a Chief Plumbing Inspector available.
- 3. The City has determined that Senior Electrical Inspectors and Senior Plumbing Inspectors will perform the duties of Chief Inspector when Mr. McDonald is not available. The City will pay Senior Electrical Inspectors and Senior Plumbing Inspectors a premium of \$1.16 per hour for all hours worked when they are assigned Chief Inspector duties, because of the higher level of technical knowledge and skill required to perform the Chief Inspector duties.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The City is authorized to pay Senior Electrical Inspectors and Senior Plumbing Inspectors who perform the duties of Chief Inspector when Mr. McDonald is not available a premium of \$1.16 per hour for all hours worked when they are assigned Chief Inspector duties, because of the higher level of technical knowledge and skill required to perform the Chief Inspector duties.
- b. The Mayor and City Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the premium from the Bureau of Development Services' Budget.

Section 2.

The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay would create problems in determining pay for all hours worked by employees who perform the duties of Chief Inspector; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
