This legislation may result in the loss of up to 9 metered parking stalls. The pay station associated with these stalls has been out of service since January 2011 due to adjacent construction. Extrapolating data from the nearest pay station, the loss of these 9 stalls represents approximately \$4,000 in lost parking meter revenue annually.

a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This Council item will require new developments to include wider sidewalks, fewer onstreet parking spaces, larger street trees, and other amenities.

### b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

A stakeholder group was convened to develop the new standards. Adjacent property owners and both the Pearl and Northwest neighborhoods were represented. The group met four times in late 2010 and in 2011. The project was a subset of the Pearl District Access and Circulation Plan. Pettygrove Street recommendations were presented to that project's Stakeholder Advisory Committee on a regular basis, which had broader representation from neighborhood and business groups, and modal advocacy organizations. The recommendations were presented at a public open house on November 9, 2011.

## c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? The stakeholder group was directly involved in all aspects of the development of the proposed amendment, from initial concept development to final design refinements.
