ORDER ON REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION

An Order of Dismissal in the above-captioned case was issued by the undersigned ALJ on December 8, 2005. The basis for the Order of Dismissal, and the cancelling of the hearing scheduled for December 21, 2005, was that the Board lacks jurisdiction to address any issues or provide any remedies under the workers' compensation law with respect to claimant's January 14, 1994 injury claim with Multnomah County. On December 16, 2005 the Hearings Division received a letter from claimant asking for a review of the "Motion to Dismiss" and requesting that the above-captioned case be put back on the docket for a hearing on December 21, 2005.

I construe claimant's letter requesting "a review" of the "Motion to Dismiss" to be a request for reconsideration of the December 8, 2005 Order of Dismissal. As noted in the Order of Dismissal, this case involves claimant's January 14, 1994 injury claim with Multnomah County. The County issued a denial of the claim on June 13, 1994. In an Order issued by the Workers' Compensation Board on January 8, 1997, the Board determined that claimant did not timely appeal the County's June 13, 1994 denial of his January 14, 1994 injury claim and, therefore, the denial was final by operation of law. The December 8, 2005 Order of Dismissal also noted that the Board's January 8, 1997 Order became final long ago and is binding in this case. Because the County's denial of claimant's January 14, 1994 injury claim is final as a matter of law, I concluded that the Board has no jurisdiction to address any issues or provide any remedies under Oregon's workers' compensation law with respect to claimant's January 14, 1994 injury claim. Claimant's December 16, 2005 letter presents no argument or legal authority that warrants a different conclusion. Accordingly, the December 8, 2005 Order dismissing this case and cancelling the December 21, 2005 hearing must stand.

(a) A request for hearing is filed not later than the 60th day after the mailing of the denial to the claimant; or

(b) The request is filed not later than the 180th day after the mailing of the denial and the claimant establishes at a hearing that there was good cause for failure to file the request by the 60th day after the mailing of the denial."

Under this provision, claimant must request a hearing within 60 days of the mailing date of the denial. If a request for hearing is filed later than 60 days of the mailing date of the denial, but not later than 180 days, a claimant may still request a hearing provided that good cause is established. However, if a hearing is requested more than 180 days after the mailing date of the denial, the request for hearing is untimely, regardless of whether good cause is established. <u>See Nancy E. Petock</u>, 46 Van Natta 1285 (1994); <u>Richard I. Bowe</u>, 41 Van Natta 1754 (1989).

Although claimant presented evidence that may have established good cause for failing to request a hearing within 180 days, his request for hearing was filed well after 180 days from the June 13, 1994 denial. Because the request for hearing was filed more than 180 days from the date of the denial, the statute prohibits his request for hearing regardless of the circumstances. While claimant may well have had a valid workers' compensation claim, the failure to appeal the denial within 180 days precludes him from now asserting that his January 14, 1994 accident, and its residuals, should be the responsibility of the employer. Accordingly, claimant's request for hearing must be dismissed. ORS 656.319(1).

In reaching this conclusion, I acknowledge claimant's argument concerning ORS Chapter 655 (Inmate Injury Fund). However, as pointed out by the employer's counsel, that provision applies only to state correctional institutions and not those administered by individual counties. <u>See</u> ORS 655.510(4) Finally, I am sympathetic to claimant's frustration with the Multnomah County correctional institution as well as with his prior counsel. Yet, neither of those disputes are within the jurisdiction of this forum and I do not have the authority to resolve those complaints, regardless of their merit.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that claimant's request for hearing is dismissed. The employer's denial, dated June 13, 1994 is upheld.

Notice to all parties: If you are dissatisfied with this Order, you may, within thirty (30) days after the mailing date on this Order, request a review by the Workers' Compensation Board, 2250 McGilchrist S.E., Salem, Oregon 97310. Any such request for review shall be mailed to the Board at the above address with copies of such request mailed to all other parties to this proceeding. Both of these actions must be taken within 30 days of the Administrative Law Judge's order.

When one party requests a review by the Board, the other party or parties shall have the remainder of the 30-day period and in no case less than 10 days in which to request Board review in the same manner. The 10 day minimum is provided even if it extends the time allowed to request Board review beyond 30 days.

Failure to mail the request for review to the Board and mail copies of the request to all other parties within the time allowed will result in the loss of your right to appeal this order and the Board will be unable to review the Administrative Law Judge's decision.
