Belmont Neighbors Seek Good Neighbor Agreements

Living in a neighborhood like Sunnyside, with great restaurants, shops, bars, and entertainment just a few blocks away, is a real blessing. A night out on Belmont or Hawthorne can be followed by a short stroll back to the quiet and comfort of one's own home. For neighbors living very close to the hot spots, however, relaxing at home or in the yard can be difficult when there are scores of people having a great time just over the fence.

The SNA Land Use and Transportation Committee invites neighbors and liquor licensees from around Belmont between SE 33rd and 34th Avenues to our next meeting on February 13 at 7:30 p.m. with the aim of negotiating a group Good Neighbor Agreement. This agreement should lead to hear each other's perspectives. One set of rules governing this issue that already exists is referred to as the Time, Place, and Manner Ordinance. While not perfect, this does provide a framework within which to register complaints about problems associated with establishments that serve alcohol. Free Lead Abatement Workshop in Sunnyside Feb. 13 By Sherrie Smith, Community Energy Project

In recent years, a lot of attention has been given to lead poisoning. The focus has been largely on recalled items, but most lead exposure occurs in older homes as paint deteriorates or is disturbed. Lead poisoning can cause brain injury in children, especially those under six years old, and pregnant women. Most exposure comes from lead-based paint, and 50 percent of cases occur because the paint was disturbed in remodeling projects.

Families concerned about lead poisoning while living in pre-1978 housing have a host of tools available to them for learning about lead issues, prevention tactics, and even removal. Community Energy Project provides free workshops to the community on lead poisoning prevention, addressing The purpose of the TPM ordinance is to provide an avenue for neighbors to address chronic livability issues associated with problem liquor outlets. Specifically, the goal of the TPM process is to:

Provide an avenue for neighbors to address livability and public safety concerns tied to specific liquor licenses;

Provide an avenue for licensees,

neighbors, police, crime prevention, and other city resources to identify and solve livability and public safety concerns;

Consolidate complaints from multiple sources and evaluate the validity of concerns and issues related to a specific liquor license outlet; and

Provide a legal recourse where nuisance activity related to liquor license concerns is substantiated.

Some bars and neighbors already have good working relationships, but others do not (yet). We intend to go beyond what the city can enforce, but for this process to work well we need neighbors to join us at our monthly Land Use and Transportation Committee meetings, meet the owners and managers of the establishments, and work out the details of these agreements sitting around the table. It has worked before and can work again, but our small team can't do it without you.

In other news, the Sunnyside Sunflower Intersection needs a new coordinator for the annual repainting, the Winter Carnival at the Sunnyside Centenary United Methodist Church takes place on February 18, and we will be showing a film at the Bagdad Theater on February 19 as a joint fundraiser with the Richmond Neighborhood Association. Articles on these events appear in this newsletter.

better communication and clearer expectations among those living and working near this vibrant stretch of Belmont.

The primary issues we hope to address include late-night patio noise and sidewalk seating. Establishing a primary—and responsive—contact at each business is also important; noise issues can often be dealt with before they escalate if neighbors feel their concerns are being listened to and addressed.

A group agreement can be desirable to bar owners who don't want to feel at a disadvantage for closing their patios earlier than establishments without the same agreement. As new businesses come to Belmont, such agreements help to make apparent from opening day what is expected of them as good neighbors, and they, in turn, can expect the patronage of their happy, and well-rested, neighbors.

Clean & Safe

Good morning my name is Lisa Frisch, Downtown Retail Development Manager of the Downtown Clean & Safe District.

I am here today on behalf of the Downtown Clean & Safe District to support the resolution before you to authorize the city's Office of Neighborhood Involvement and the Portland Police Bureau to ask the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to initiate rulemaking on liquor licenses for food carts.

We appreciate the role that food carts play as a part of Portland's food culture, as an amenity to downtown workers and visitors, and as a new class of small businesses that makes our city unique. Despite the positive feelings we all have about food carts, there is a lot of potential for liability and public safety issues when it comes to selling alcoholic beverages- either in a bricks and mortar establishment or food cart.

Given that we just went through the long and thoughtful process of recommending downtown be designated as an alcohol impact to minimize problems associated with alcohol consumption in public, rushing to distribute liquor licenses to a new class of operators with only vague and unenforceable best practices is a grave concern. The unintended consequences and negative impacts on neighboring businesses, residences, and the community at large demand that OLCC step back and study this issue further.

The Downtown Clean & Safe district is not supportive of allowing food carts to sell alcoholic beverages with either on or off premises licenses at this time. Given the multiple ownerships, the difficulty in establishing responsibility for consumption monitoring and enforcement, the difficulty in defining and maintaining designated areas for alcohol consumption and proximity to other businesses, we don't believe there is a workable enforcement mechanism to address the inevitable issues that additional liquor outlets in downtown would generate, at least under the best practices the OLCC has proposed.

While we currently oppose allowing downtown food carts to sell alcoholic beverages under annual licenses, we encourage the city to further explore this issue and work with the OLCC to establish clear guidelines for enforcement through a rulemaking process with community stakeholders.
