2011 Grant Award Financial Summary

- Thirty one grant applications this round
 - Total requested funds of \$125,548
 - Funded 43% of requests
- Seventeen grant applications selected
 - Funding total \$54,300
 - Total of leveraged funds \$350,667

Estimated 646% leverage on funds awarded
