Report on Transportation Sponsorships and Donations 2010

City Code stipulates that any donation, gift, grant, lease or loan exceeding \$250 shall first be approved by City Council. Passed by the Council in 2005, Ordinance 179806 authorized the PBOT Director to execute agreements accepting sponsorships, donations, contributions and cost-sharing agreements for transportation programs, in a form acceptable to the City Attorney, and in amounts not to exceed \$150,000. Passed by Council in 2009, Ordinance 182573 authorized the PBOT Director to accept and acknowledge individual sponsorships, donations, and contributions for Sunday Parkways projects in amounts not to exceed \$10,000 per individual per year.

Both ordinances also direct PBOT to report annually to the City Council on the numbers, types and dollar value of sponsorships, donations, contributions and cost-sharing agreements that have been executed.

In 2010, PBOT received a total of \$227,106.44 in donations (in kind and cash). The majority of these donations were received by the Transportation Options Division for the promotion and support of Sunday Parkways. Donations were also received by Maintenance Operations for pothole repair and by the Transportation Planning Division for printing of bikeway maps. These donations have helped foster relationships and partnerships between the City of Portland, local area and national businesses, community organizations, and citizens.

ORDINANCE No. 179806

Authorize the Director of the Portland Office of Transportation to execute agreements pertaining to sponsorships, donations, contributions and cost-sharing for transportation programs, services and projects in a form acceptable to the City Attorney's Office and in amounts not to exceed \$150,000 per agreement (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Building and promoting partnerships between the City of Portland and local businesses helps ensure that community goals are realized through transportation system improvements, such as a healthy economy and a livable and safe community.
- 2. Cost sharing agreements are an important part of a sustainable funding framework that maximize the resources available to fund projects that protect the public's investment in a balanced transportation system.
- 3. That City Code 5.36.090 stipulates that any donation, gift, grant, lease or loan by which the City shall be obligated in an amount exceeding \$250 shall first be approved by the Council by special ordinance.
- 4. The most efficient method for processing sponsorships, donations, contributions and cost sharing agreements for less than \$150,000 would be to authorize the Director of PDOT to execute these agreements.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Utilities and Auditor to authorize the Director of the Portland Office of Transportation to execute agreements in amounts not to exceed \$150,000 for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Portland Office of Transportation shall report annually to the City Council on the number, types and dollar value of sponsorships, donations, contributions and cost-sharing agreements that have been executed.

ORDINANCE No. 182573

*Authorize the Director of the Portland Bureau of Transportation to accept and acknowledge individual sponsorships, donations and contributions for Sunday Parkways projects not to exceed \$10,000 per individual per year (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Building and promoting partnerships between the City of Portland and area residents helps ensure that community goals are realized through transportation projects like Sunday Parkways, such as a healthy economy and a livable and safe community.
- 2. That City Code 5.36.090 stipulates that any donation, gift, grant, lease or loan by which the City shall be obligated in an amount exceeding \$250 shall first be approved by the Council by special ordinance.
- 3. The most efficient method for processing individual sponsorships, donations, and contributions of less than \$10,000 for Sunday Parkway projects would be to authorize the Director of PBOT to accept and acknowledge all such sponsorships, donations and contributions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and Auditor to authorize the Director of the Portland Bureau of Transportation to accept and acknowledge on behalf of the City, in a form acceptable to the City Attorney's Office, individual sponsorships, donations, and contributions for Sunday Parkway projects in amounts not to exceed \$10,000 for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Portland Bureau of Transportation shall use the amounts collected for Sunday Parkway projects.
- c. The Portland Bureau of Transportation shall report annually to the City Council on the number, types and dollar value of sponsorships, donations, and contributions that have been accepted and acknowledged for Sunday Parkway projects.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because marketing and outreach has begun and the community is asking how they can contribute; therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and anfter its passage by Council.
