Subject: Appointment and Reappointment to the Noise Review Board

There are two positions on the Noise Review Board that are vacant due to term limited outgoing member and a reappointment. The membership categories are Citizen at Large and Construction Industry.

Outreach

There is a vacancy left open recently by Vance Yoakum completing his 2nd full term on the board. The notification of the position was well publicized on several web sites and blogs. The result of the greater than usual web presence resulted in 10 candidates submitting interest forms. The Noise Officer, Paul van Orden, and the current Chair of the Noise Review Board, David Sweet, reviewed the applications and selected the 4 strongest candidates to interview with a panel.

Appointment

The interview panel included David Sweet, Michelle Seward (BDS Sr. Planner), and Paul van Orden. The panel was in 100% agreement that candidate, **Carol Gossett**, was steps above the other candidates and therefore I am recommending her to fill the vacant Citizen at Large position.

Carol has extensive professional experience as a planner in other parts of the United States. Her experience, as you can see from the attached PDF, is extensive. It is impressive, the breadth of the projects she has worked on, including efforts for the State of Missouri on their Workforce Investment Board. In her short time in Portland she has availed herself of the opportunity to be very active in the community. She answered the interview questions formulated for the final candidates in an articulate manner. Carol's first 3-year term will be from April 4, 2012 to expire April 3, 2015.

Reappointment

I am also recommending that **Julie Greb** be reappointed to a 3-year term as the Construction Industry representative on the Board. Julie has been an ongoing asset to the Board and has balanced out the needs of the construction industry with the needs of the community. The firm she works for, Stacy and Witbeck, has a strong record of limiting livability concerns on their projects here in Portland. Julie also helps the Board demonstrate its commitment to leadership in the realm of women in engineering. Julie's second 3-year term will be from February 29, 2012 to expire February 28, 2015.

With these proposed appointments, the Noise Review Board has no vacancies until February 28, 2013. I have enclosed an updated Noise Review Board membership list for your records.

Noise Review Board:

The Noise Review Board meets monthly to review major requests for noise variances and recommends Noise Code changes. The Noise Review Board is unique in the United States in offering citizens and the business community a direct way to be involved in helping set the City of Portland's policies related to the environmental issue of noise pollution. The five member board is comprised of three citizen representatives, one person from the construction industry, and a professional working in the field of Acoustics. Members serve a 3-year term.

The Board has two primary purposes. The first is to review complex requests for a variance from the noise code, Title 18 of the City of Portland. The second purpose is to help establish the direction the City is headed in addressing emerging noise problems in the community. A few recent examples include work on leaf blower regulations and new rules limiting the noise from night time garbage collection. The board is **helpful** in educating other government agencies about the important role that they can play in helping make Portland a quieter and therefore more livable city.
