Planning and Sustainability Commission (PSC) Briefing/Work Session October 9, 2012

City of Portland - Metro Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA): Intent to Continue Watershed Health-Related Efforts and Collaboration Post Title 13 Compliance

Staff recommends that the PSC:

- Endorse the draft IGA and ordinance with the suggested amendments,
- Forward draft IGA and ordinance to the City Council for approval, and
- Authorize staff to make minor changes to compliance request report (e.g., additional reference to underlying City plans, policies and principles, upcoming efforts).

Recap:

- 1. On July 24, 2012 the PSC held a public hearing on the City's draft request for Metro determination of substantial compliance with Title 13, Nature in Neighborhoods.
- 2. City staff described existing regulations and non-regulatory programs that form the basis for the request. Metro noted that City programs are among the strongest programs in the region.
- 3. Six people testified. Most supported the City's compliance with Title 13; however there was concern that recent legal challenges and budget cuts are limiting City efforts. Most testifiers also supported establishing a voluntary IGA and provided some specific suggestions.
- 4. The PSC voted unanimously to recommend approval of the request for determination Title 13 compliance. The PSC supported establishing the IGA and asked to review the draft.

Materials for consideration:

1. Draft IGA

- a. Follows the draft outline that the PSC discussed on July 24
- b. Includes components requested by the PSC and the public such as:
- Updating existing plans and regulations for the Columbia Corridor
- Tentative timelines for planning projects
- More topics for City and Metro collaboration (e.g., ecosystem services, habitatfriendly design, climate mitigation/adaptation, coordination with the Intertwine Alliance)
- c. Reflects additional comments from BES, Portland Parks, Metro and the City Attorney
- 2. Draft ordinance presents context and authorizes:
 - a. BPS director to submit the Title 13 compliance determination to Metro, and
 - b. Directors of BPS, BES and Parks to enter into the IGA with Metro.
- 3. Amendments to draft IGA and ordinance reflect discussion w/PSC leadership on 10/5/12
- **Next:** Staff will submit the draft ordinance, request for determination of substantial compliance, and IGA to City Council (hearing likely in November), followed by submittal to Metro.
