ORDINANCE No. 185698

* Authorize the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to apply for grant funding of \$50,000 from the Bullitt Foundation and the Funders' Network for Smart Growth to integrate social equity metrics and outcomes into the Climate Action Plan (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In 1993, Portland became the first U.S. city to adopt a climate action plan, prioritizing a compact urban form, multi-modal transportation choices, walkable neighborhoods, efficient buildings, renewable energy resources and urban forestry.
- 2. The City of Portland is a leader in climate policy and actions and strives to advance equity outcomes in Portland while establishing replicable approaches for other cities.
- 3. Previous climate plans, including the 2009 City of Portland / Multnomah County Climate Action Plan, acknowledged the importance of equity, but they did not establish specific metrics or actions to prioritize equity outcomes.
- 4. To date, many climate protection efforts have generated community benefits, but the economic and health benefits are not shared equitably across the city, especially among people of color and low-income communities.
- 5. The Portland Plan, adopted by Council in April 2012, established equity as a core priority to establishing a prosperous, educated and healthy city.
- 6. The Climate Action Plan is due to be updated in 2013, and an important new element in the plan is to establish equity metrics.
- 7. Funding from the Bullitt Foundation and the Funders' Network for Smart Growth will enable the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to work with Multnomah County and community organizations to:
 - a. Develop metrics to establish equity impacts of carbon-reduction actions.
 - b. Select and refine climate actions to improve equity outcomes of the 2013 Climate Action Plan.
 - c. In partnership with community development organizations and social networks, develop an implementation plan to integrate equity and carbon outcomes in construction projects in underserved neighborhoods.
 - d. Summarize climate equity metrics, findings, and lessons learned for the benefit of other jurisdictions and organizations working on climate action.
- 8. No match is required for this grant funding, but the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is prepared to contribute in-kind match in the form of staff time that is currently included in its FY12-13 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is hereby authorized to apply for grant funding from the Bullitt Foundation and the Funders' Network for Smart Growth in the amount of \$50,000.

b. The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the grant application must be submitted by November 1, 2012. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
