This ordinance reduces net appropriation in 38 funds by a total of \$14.4 million, including a total of \$4.8 million in increased appropriation in the General Fund; this includes a \$2.1 million addition to various contingencies (and a \$9,766 draw on unrestricted contingency).



In addition, the ordinance directs the City Budget Office to increase the General Fund Current Appropriation Level of the following:

- Department of Justice-related changes:
 - o Portland Police Bureau: \$3,984,669 ongoing and an additional \$152,320 one-time
 - o Office of the City Auditor: \$278,047 ongoing
 - o Office of the City Attorney: \$429,789 ongoing
 - o Bureau of Emergency Communications: \$28,636 one-time
- City Budget Office Creation- related changes:
 - o Office of Management and Finance: (\$2,059,614)
 - o City Budget Office: \$2,059,614
