I am saddened to see not only trails on the outer edges of Forest Park degraded by bicyclers, but the inner sections of the Wildwood trail. Many of the cyclist are riding during the late afternoon, early morning or evening hours. I have witnessed all three on the Macleay side of Wildwood. In addition, riders speed down Holman lane, which is posted as uphill only.

I have lived in this neighborhood and walked in Forest Park for over 40 years. I have had many frightening encounters with bicyclists on speeding around blind comers on Wildwood Trail. I'm able to jump out of the way. I doubt that families with young children would be so lucky.

most of the trails are not designed for both walkers with dogs and cyclists. I have had two narrow misses for collisions with well meaning cyclists - the combination of a rapidly expanding user population and cycle traffic will cause severe damage to trails

I have so many wonderful memories wandering these trails as a child, and then again with neighborhood kids I've babysat or nannied for over the years. It would have been much more dangerous if not impossible to let a 3 year old explore the wonder of nature if there were the constant threat of a bicyclist racing down the trails. I am an avid biker and love biking, but it is also important for our community and for our children to keep trails pedestrian-only! Thank you!

The forest area is Portland is a valuable resource. Please keep it viable for and accessible for years to come.

As a long time resident of the periphery of Forest Park, the increasing stress on this incredible habitat becomes more apparent. I would suggest that whatever stopgap measures we can introduce to reasonably control any further trail and parking areas impact would certainly be to the common good. Re-naming and increasing the the preservational commitment will best serve the public good. I feel that an annual parking permit system along with an additional license fee levied on the trail bike community would help facilitate the needed funds for this most important reformation.

One winter day I was walking a puppy on the Cumberland trail. The puppy was on a 5' leash. We were almost at a corner going up hill and could not see the trail in front of us when suddenly around the corner, coming down the hill was a bicyclist. He was going fast and could not stop in the mud. I went to one side of the trail and the puppy, terrified, went to the other side. He went between us. I fortunately had the sense to drop the leash and the bicyclist rode over it. It was really frightening. We could have been badly hurt. I have walked almost every trail in Forest Park. The trails in Forest Park are narrow, sometimes steep and very slippery in the winter. I do not see how it would be possible to have trails with both bikes and pedestrians sharing the trail. In the last thirty years the use of the park has increased significantly. I no longer walk it on sunny summer weekends. So where would you put the bicycle trails? And if you made 30% of the trails "bike friendly" that, in fact, reduces already crowded pedestrian access to the remaining 60% as the bikes would quickly force pedestrians off the "bike friendly" trails.

Why reward an inconsiderate user group by adding more trails for them to abuse? There are numerous options on land owned by metro or in logged off areas way out skyline--send them there where they will not intimidate pedestrians, children and the elderly. Thank you.

I use the trails of Forest Park as a blind person with a guide dog and I cannot jump out of the way when a cyclist approaches at any speed. Most riders do not observe common courtesy by staying completely off the trails that are dedicated for pedestrians. There is no enforcement or follow through on the laws. Also, I want to remind people that Forest Park is a place that can be accessed by bus for those unable to drive. Mountain bikers should think about the fact that they frequently intimidate every other user of Forest Park. There are not many choices for those unable to drive. Thank you for your consideration.

Have you thought about asking the political pac that has put up all this money to lobby the council to use their money to purchase land close to the city and give it to metro and parks and recreation. They could design their own park strictly for mountain biking and it would be much better than trying to mix it up with pedestrians, children, the elderly, etc. Thanks.

Restore the Health and Safety of Forest Park

- There are currently significant **risks to pedestrian safety in Forest Park** caused by widespread **illegal cycling** on pedestrian only trails.
- The Forest Park Natural Resources Management Plan, ordinance 168509, includes specific rules and guidelines to protect pedestrian safety:
 - 1. Bikes are limited to specified roads and fire lanes in the park.
 - 2. All trails open to bikes, which by definition are shared trails, must be 8 feet wide, must have good line of sight, must not conflict with other user groups (like equestrians) and must not terminate in a pedestrian trail which would channel cyclists to trails not open for their use.
 - 3. Park users must both be safe and feel safe.
- **City Ordinances** that are posted pertaining to cyclists in the park are unclear and out of date. The one most commonly posted in the park, 16.26.250, was repealed in 1992. If you goggle this ordinance the first 2 items you find, written by cyclists advertise the fact that this ordinance has been repealed
- As I understand it the current relevant citation is the ordinance that applies to restrictions on vehicles in parks is <u>16.70.560</u>, which gives the Parks Superintendent the authority to restrict or prohibit types of vehicle traffic in parks. "<u>Vehicle</u>" includes bikes. For any such restriction to take effect, Parks must post a notice in a conspicuous place. There is no fine specified in that ordinance, which means that the general fine at <u>1.01.140</u> for violations of city ordinances applies: \$500. I have never seen these ordinances posted in the park!
- There is an ordinance that has recently been posted in Hoyt Arboretum, 16.70.560, which states that bikes using the paths can be impounded. As far as I know there is no method to enforce this intervention.
- **Signage** restricting bikes from pedestrian trails is not universal, is out of date and newer signs are easily vandalized. Park Ranger Bob McCoy told me that new signs are often gone in 2 days
- Enforcement is completely ineffective. The Park Ranger, Rob McCoy told me that he has not restricted a single cyclist's from the park during his tenure. The Ranger does not have the authority to cite trespassing cyclists.
- Other cities that allow cyclists in their city parks have much larger enforcement forces and more robust enforcement capabilities, and they still run into user conflicts and safety issues
- The single track advisory Committee of 2009-2010 specifically excluded safety as a consideration
- The leadership of the single track cycling community and some park staff have publicly admitted that they ride on the pedestrian trails

• The biking community, expressing themselves on the bikeportland.org site have made comments such as ,"these are rules not laws, it is not illegal to ride on pedestrian trails," "get out your headlamps, the trails are open at night," The back of the signs are blank, this is a free country"

Actions we are requesting from City Council have to do with Policy and Ordinances

- Please stand behind current land use law as articulated in the Forest Park Natural Resources Management Plan. The Plan's rules and concepts serve to protect the Park and the safety of pedestrians
- Reinstate the repealed ordinance that is so widely posted in the park or clarify which ordinances apply with their associated fines.
- The ordinances need to be posted and need to be in effect. Universal signage is essential to any enforcement efforts. Consider stenciling signs on trees with nontoxic paint to reduce cost and vandalism
- Educate the community of cyclists and pedestrians
- Ask Parks to plan enforcement actions in coordination with police as suggested in the management plan to let cyclists know that the laws will be enforced.
- Given the limited force of rangers to enforce the law, ask Parks to fund and erect physical barriers such as stiles s to make it harder for cyclists to accidentally or intentionally ride on pedestrian only trails

We are presenting a petition from concerned citizens asking that the management plan be upheld and that pedestrian safety hazards be addressed. Any plans to add new trails or increase access for cyclists will make safety hazards to pedestrians greater. Resources must be directed towards pedestrian safety.

Restore the Health and Safety of Forest Park

I am coming to City Council to ask for help in addressing the current safety hazard to pedestrians in Forest Park caused by illegal cycling on pedestrian only trails. Individuals, medical groups and civic institutions have written letters to City Council and the Parks department over the past few years concerned about the safety hazards of sharing narrow trails. Trail sharing, which has never been approved, is happening right now! The safety and well being of pedestrians, who comprise 92% of park users, is being compromised. Citizens need the City Council to stand behind the Forest Park Natural Resources Management Plan, ordinance 168509, which recognizes the need for safe cycling in the park and safety protection for all users. Right now there is an enforcement failure. We lack clear and enforceable ordinances with specific fines that can be posted. Our single Forest Park Ranger has not excluded a single cyclist from the park during his tenure. Cyclists ride everywhere with impunity. A new enforcement strategy is needed that includes ordinances, universal vandal resistant and accurate signage, physical deterrents and interventions to stop illegal cycling on pedestrian only trails.
