2012 General Grant Award Financial Summary

- Twenty-five grant applications received
 - Total requested funds of \$112,271
 - Funded 49% of requests (by dollar amount)
- Thirteen grant applications selected
 - Funding total \$54,498
 - Total of leveraged funds \$490,294

Estimated 900% leverage on funds awarded

2012 Civic Engagement Grant Award Financial Summary

- Ten grant applications received Seven selected
 - \$118,280 requested
 - \$54,805 available
 - Funded 46% of requests (by dollar amount)

Civic Engagement Grants are particularly important as the grant awardees demonstrate "next steps" in leadership development

- Thirty-five grant applications received
 - Total requested funds of \$163,651
 - Funded 29% of requests (by dollar amount)
- Thirteen grant applications selected
 - Funding total \$47,400
 - Total of leveraged funds \$335,154

Estimated 700% leverage on funds awarded

- Ten grant applications received Seven chosen
 - \$81,590 requested
 - \$52,600 available
 - Funded 64% of requests (by dollar amount)
