#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Attached is an ordinance to increase Moore Iacofano Goltsman, Inc.'s (MIG) Contract No. 30002636 by \$409,704 and extend termination date to December 31, 2014 to allow for additional consultant services for the subject project. Additional services include: Inspect Tier 2 and 3 facilities. Work includes: prepare facility diagrams; conduct facility surveys; prepare draft facility reports; transition plan report development; prioritize with stakeholders; conduct prioritization workshops; produce final facility reports; and project management. New total contract amount will be \$628,818.

Upon completion of the additional services, the Redevelopment of the ADA Title II Transition Plan will be completed and each bureau will have a detailed list of deficiencies and barriers to access for persons with disabilities. Each bureau will then be prepared to address the identified areas in subsequent budgeting cycles.

There is no MWESB participation for this portion of the work.

In the Council adopted FY 2009/10 budget, the Office of Management and Finance was authorized to complete a study of all deficiencies and barriers to access for persons with disabilities in city owned or managed facilities. This study is the Redevelopment of the ADA Title II Transition Plan for the City of Portland.

RFP No. FAC020 for a consultant to provide services for the Redevelopment of the ADA Title II Transition Plan for the City of Portland was issued December 2011. Five proposals were received on January 27, 2012. A selection committee reviewed the proposals and selected Moore Iacofano Goltsman, Inc. to recommend for contract award. Because of limited funding at the time, work included inspection of Tier 1 Facilities only.

### **Prioritization Criteria:**

- *Level of use by the public:* Facilities that have a high level of public use can be assigned a higher priority;
- *Program uniqueness*: Some programs are unique to a building, facility, or park and cannot occur at another location. Seasonal availability and programs that emphasize health and wellness can be assigned a higher priority;
- *Geographic distribution:* Selecting a range of facilities that are distributed throughout the City, and considering the proximity of these facilities to public transportation help provide maximum accessibility for all residents;
- *Critical nature of the service provided:* Facilities that provide services related to accessibility, health, safety, and the administration of essential City services such as permitting and licensing can be assigned a higher priority;
- *Identified complaints*: Facilities that have a history of citizen complaints related to accessibility can be assigned a higher priority;
- *City-Owned facilities:* Facilities that are owned by the City can be assigned a higher priority over leased facilities, where another entity may be responsible to provide physical access improvements;
- *Social need:* Facilities that are identified by the Portland community of people with disabilities as high priority for accessibility improvement can be assigned a higher priority;
- *New construction:* Facilities that were renovated within the last 2 years or will be renovated within the year of this project can receive a low priority. However, this study is intended for planning purposes, if a space will be renovated or altered, it would be worthwhile to have the barriers identified prior to the alteration (for example PDX bldg had consultants perform an accessibility study cost saving to have that information a head of time).
