- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 185983 passed by the Council on April 17, 2013 and authorized a contract and provided payment for the construction of the Headworks Flow Meter Project. The existing flow meters on the conduits at Headworks are 60 to 100 years old, do not provide precise measurements and require frequent maintenance. New meters and control valves are required to provide reliable and accurate flow meters. Accurate flow measurement is a critical component in calculating the chlorine feed rate for disinfection and the chlorine contact time to meet regulatory compliance. The new meters and control valves will improve operations and improve accuracy of the chlorine feed and disinfection calculations for regulatory compliance.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$1,860,000 and the confidence level was High. Funding for this project is available in FY 13/14 Budget under WBS Element W01582.
- **9.** RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept Recommendation to award contract to J W Underground, Inc. in the amount of \$1,770,250.

10. <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT:</u> The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to construct water conduit improvements at Screen House No. 3 and the Primary Intake Structure located at 50105 SE Rock Cut Rd, Corbett, OR.
