Because the goal of this ordinance is to direct the authority to adopt rules and procedures that have informally been created and followed for years public involvement was not necessary. The goal is to improve the complaint filing system and provide a uniform complaint process with an opportunity to appeal. Input was sought from several blind persons using readers to determine if the forms were accessible. The proposed administrative rules provide a longer timeline for filing complaints and will provide a formal review and appeal process.

The Program Manager reached out to the Commission on Disability who agreed to write a letter in support of this ordinance. The Office of Equity and Human Rights reviewed the ordinance and had not commented on the substance.

7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Attached is an ordinance to reaffirm the City of Portland's American's With Disabilities Act Title II non-discrimination policy and establish rules, procedures and forms to implement program. The ordinance allows the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) authority to establish rules for an ADA complaint procedure and affirm the commitment that all of the City's programs, services and activities are accessible to persons with disabilities.

This is an administrative ordinance. For many years there has been an ADA complaint procedure housed in OMF. While the complaint process has resolved many complaints over the years, there has been no formal administrative rule outlining how complaints are managed, investigated, resolved, or appealed. This ordinance establishes authority to adopt administrative rules and forms to implement the program housed in OMF.

In preparation of filing this ordinance, staff reviewed the contents and purpose with the Disability Specialist in the Office of Neighborhood Involvement and the Commission on Disability and the Office of Equity and Human Rights.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The proposed legislation has no impact on current or future revenues.

This legislation will not increase expenditures in the current or future years. This work is in the current fiscal yar 2013-2014 budget and has been performed in OMF for many years.
