 - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item? The public involvement process for adoption of these regulations, were an essential component of that effort. It is expected that the implementation of the regulations will have a significant impact upon the entire community. It will affect property owners as well as applicants for building permits. For this component of the project (i.e., budget and staffing), there has been limited public involvement.
