This Contract was made and entered into on the 1^{st} day of September 2009 by and between <u>MICHAEL</u> <u>WILLIS ARCHITECTS</u>, hereinafter called Contractor, and the City of Portland, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, by and through its duly authorized representatives, hereinafter called City.

- 1. A Request for Proposals for architectural and engineering services for new construction for the Emergency Coordination Center was issued on April 22, 2009. Six proposals were received on May 21, 2009. A selection committee reviewed the proposals and recommended award of contract to Michael Willis Architects as they were the highest scoring proposer.
- 2. Contract No. 30000701 provides for architectural and engineering services in the amount of \$957,819 to design a new ECC facility directly adjacent to the existing Portland Communications Center located in southeast Portland. There are three main components of this project; a new ECC building, new parking lot, and realignment of a section of SE Bush Street.
- 3. The new building will serve as the City's Emergency Coordination Center and house the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM), Portland Water Bureau (PWB) Emergency Management, and Security staff.
- 4. Amendment No. 1, dated April 8, 2011, increased the contract amount \$166,251.25 to allow for additional architectural and engineering services.
- 5. Amendment No. 2 (ordinance no. 185252), dated May 2, 2012 increased the contract amount \$86,767.66 and extended the expiration date to January 1, 2014 to allow for additional architectural and engineering services.
- 6. Amendment No. 3, dated April 2013, increased the contract amount \$40,680.00 to allow for additional architectural and engineering services.
- 7. Amendment No. 4 (ordinance no. 186035), dated May 6, 2013, increased the contract amount \$82,655.00 to allow for additional architectural and engineering services.
- 8. Additional architectural and engineering services described in the attached letters dated November 1, 2013 and December 31, 2013 (Attachment No. 1) is necessary to allow Consultant to provide the following:
 - Commissioning services for the building's clean agent fire suppression system as requested by the Owner.
 - Exterior and interior signage for the PCC/ECC Campus as requested by the campus tenants.
 - Architectural and Engineering (Plumbing, Electrical) services for the installation of Owner requested equipment in lunchroom.
 - Assistance in selecting a suitable table for the equipment. Procurement and installation of the table, including seismic anchoring are not included in this scope.
 - Contract Extension of four (4) months.

9. The City of Portland and the Contractor wish to amend Contract No. 30000701 for an additional \$12,245.00 to allow for additional architectural and engineering services described in #8 above for a new total contract amount of \$1,346,417.91 and to extend the expiration date retroactively from January 1, 2014 to April 30, 2014.

All other terms and conditions shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.





- Commissioning Services for the building's clean agent fire suppression system as requested by the Owner
- Exterior and interior signage for the PCC/ECC Campus as requested by the campus tenants

The total lump sum fee is **\$ 9,165.00**. Please see below and the following attachments for a cost breakdown.

1. Commissioning – Clean Agent System	\$4,090.00

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1. Commissioning – Clean Agent System

The current commissioning scope does not cover the clean agent fire suppression system located in the two Server/Comm. Rooms. This system was included during the CD phase of the project, and utilizes an inert gas to suppress/extinguish fires while preserving sensitive electronic equipment contained in these rooms. Because this system is designed to activate before the building's water-based fire sprinkler system (which would ruin such electronic equipment), it is critical to verify that the clean agent system functions as designed. To accommodate this, the City has asked MWA to include the clean agent system as part of the project's commissioning scope. MWA's commissioning consultant – EPE, LLC - has provided a proposal to cover the commissioning of this system. <u>See Exhibit 1</u>

2. Signage – Interior and Exterior

The City has asked MWA to provide design and documentation services for building and site signage for the new ECC building and for the combined PCC/ECC campus. This signage will be based on both the requirements for the individual Client/User Group spaces within the ECC and for the collective needs of the site as a whole, with input from both PCC and ECC tenant groups. The intent is to provide informational and identification signage that is consistent in appearance, integrates with the facility design, and provides easy way-finding from the secure site entries to the specific areas within the buildings. - Assistance in selecting a suitable table for the equipment. Procurement and installation of the table, including seismic anchoring are not included in this scope.

The total lump sum fee is **\$ 3,080.00.** Please see below and the following attachments for a cost breakdown.

1. Coffee Maker and Grinder Installation:

The City intends to install a commercial grade coffee maker and grinder for the building. The equipment will be used for daily tenant use which includes large meetings and training exercises. The equipment will also be sized to allow for use during emergency activations, when it is anticipated that a large number of occupants will be working within the building 24/7 for multiple days. Given the building's location and need to operate in a 'stand-alone' condition when other buildings and businesses are not available, the sizing and placement of this equipment within the facility will support the core function of this building.

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The equipment will require dedicated circuits of 200-240v power in addition to a cold water supply line. MWA will assess the existing building infrastructure to allow for the most cost-effective routing and installation of the equipment and related electrical and plumbing supplies.
