### 1) Legislation Title:

Establish an agreement and policy between the Bureau of Environmental Services and the Portland Bureau of Transportation to govern management and cost responsibility for future sewer maintenance under streetcar tracks in SW Montgomery Street. (Resolution)

### 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

PBOT will construct new streetcar tracks and infrastructure (Streetcar System) to supplement the existing Streetcar System currently in SW Montgomery. The Bureau of Environmental Services has worked with the project team to review and approve the design, which allows the streetcar tracks to be constructed above the existing 12" sanitary and 15" storm sewers. This will impact future sewer maintenance activities. To alleviate financial concerns over increased maintenance costs due to the access restriction, PBOT and BES have prepared this agreement and recommend establishing a City policy to allow BES access to the sewer and a means to recover increased maintenance costs.
