Leif Hansen

Leif Hansen has 15+ years in Telecommunications with more than 10 years of that spent managing regional area networks in the Pacific Northwest. Leif has managed the construction, design, implementation and operation of DWDM, SONET, Ethernet and routed networks for NoaNet Oregon and LS Networks. Previous to working at NoaNet Oregon he was a sales engineer for the Washington based NoaNet. While in that role he worked to develop Ethernet and TDM based solutions for wholesale customers. Leif's specialty is interpreting customer needs and translating them into appropriate high value and reliable network implementations.

During his reign at LS networks he has grown the network from 25 to over 100 points of presence in Oregon while providing leading technology to mostly rural communities. While running operations for LS Networks and NoaNet Oregon for the past 10 years Leif has yet to lose a single customer due to support related issues.
