Appointments:

Chabre Vickers serves on the Board of Directors for the local social and environmental justice nonprofit, Groundwork Portland as the Co-Board Chairperson. She also sits on the Executive Board for the Portland African American Leadership Forum, and serves as the Co-Board Chair for the Civic Engagement and Leadership Development committee. Among many honors, Chabre received the Spirit of Portland Emerging Leader Award and the same honor by the Human Rights Commission in 2012.

Rebecca Naga currently works as the Community Engagement Coordinator for the Oregon Health Authority's Office of Equity and Inclusion. She is an active member of the African Women's Coalition and the Portland African American Leadership Forum. Previously she was worked for Oregon State Representative Lew Frederick, the Oregon Bus Project, and Congresswoman Eddie Bernice Johnson. She hails from Dallas, Texas where she was born and raised in a small Ethiopian immigrant community that forever fueled her passion for advocacy, community organizing and the American political process.
