

Connecting the ODOTS: Design Recommendations for Future SE Powell

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This handout is to accompany the presentation of our design concepts for the ODOT parcels on Powell Blvd. We are presenting the designs that we have created using the information found in our research, and the feedback we received from the community on our surveys. The results to our surveys are also included with the English version of the survey. Executive Summary

This year, we, the students of PLACE (Planning and Leadership Across City Environments) received our project from the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS). We were assigned to redesign various ODOT-owned parcels of land along the stretch of Powell Boulevard from 50th to 82nd Ave. BPS plans to introduce a high-capacity transit system on Powell, and with that knowledge, and the assignment of creating design options for the concrete parcels, we began. We went through the process of research and assessment, which culminated in proposals and project recommendations for BPS to potentially develop.

Findings:

- Parking
 - It was found that although parking was not important to everyone, there was enough interest that it was decided as an option for the parcels.
 - Research into permeable pavement was found to be a possible improvement that addressed the issue of stormwater as highlighted in the Portland Plan. To further address stormwater drainage, and the communities desire of greenery, there would be an increase in well kept vegetation in the parking lots.
- Transit
 - 70% of the people surveyed agreed that the current stops suited their needs, 54% did not feel safe waiting for transit at night and 25% did not feel safe waiting for transit during the day
- Greenspace/Community gathering space
 - On the site visit, it was observed that the parcels were not community gathering spaces, in fact they were mostly vacant. The surveys showed a huge interest in parks and greenspace in general, with the three most desired options for the remodeled parcels being more trees, parks, and gardens.

Recommendations:

- Parking
 - We recommend trying to incorporate these elements into the parking design: rain gardens, handicapped parking, more vegetation, improved drainage, permeable pavement, increased sustainability, bike racks, and improved safety (lighting)
 - Also we recommend adding parking parcels near transit stops to encourage transit by "park and ride".
- Transit
 - We recommend trying to incorporate these elements into the transit design: seating, shelter, bike racks, solar panels on top, a way to buy tickets on outside to speed up the process,

accessibility for both directions of traffic, trees, native plants, and improved safety through more lighting.


- We recommend incorporating two new and separate lanes on Powell for HTC. This could be accommodated for by cutting off some of the soft barrier between the sidewalk and road, and taking away the median. The south side of the road (the side with the parcels) would have two lanes (one for each direction) dedicated to HTC, which would both go around one central bus stop located in a parcel (see diagrams of the designed transit stop and streetscape on page 5).
- Greenspace/Community gathering space
 - We recommend trying to incorporate these elements into the greenspace/community gathering space design: a refurbished streetcar that can be used for a library, a fountain, vegetation, native plants, a soft barrier from the road, bike racks, a sculpture, a community mural, benches, picnic tables, and more lighting.

Methodology:

- Case studies
 - Transit case studies were found of high capacity transit systems and high capacity transit stops, with evidence coming from both local and international case studies, such as Qatar and Brazil.
 - Other options besides transit were researched. Examples of redesigning the turnouts into parks, gardens, art, and even small libraries were researched, with evidence from Los Angeles and Portland to name a few.
- Surveys
 - 163 surveys were completed both online (sent out by various neighborhood associations) and in person over the course of 4 days, with responses in English, Mandarin, and Spanish.
 - Many kinds of questions were asked to get the residents' opinions on a broad range of subjects.
- Interviews
 - Interviews of experts in urban planning, design, and transit as well as business owners on Powell were carried out, and gave deeper insight to the parking situation and many other topics.
- Literature and Data
 - Demographics of the area, as well as research into the Portland Plan, the Climate Action Plan, and the Powell Streetscape Plan were investigated.


