- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 186581 adopted May 21, 2014 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the East Delta Synthetic Turf Fields project. Portland Parks and Recreation (PP&R) owns Delta Park which includes seven softball fields, one all-weather synthetic sports field and eight grass sports fields. PP&R's 2020 Vision Plan for Delta Park contemplates converting the existing grass fields to all-weather synthetic sports fields and the addition of field lights. The City recognizes the significance of Delta Park as a regional sports facility, contributing to the vitality of the community and economy and has experienced increasing demand for its use by sport field users. Three new synthetic turf fields with improvements will be built under this contract.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$2,500,000. Funds are available in the City of Portland Parks Systems Development Changes which was approved by ordinance 186266.
- 9. **RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:** Accept Recommendation to award contract to Field Turf USA, Inc. in the amount of \$2,958,338.00.
- 10. SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT: Work in the contract includes synthetic turf fields at East Delta Park as indicated in the contract documents. Work includes:

erosion control and tree protection, excavation and removal of existing field drainage and irrigation systems, installation of new sub-base and drainage, stormwater treatment swales, asphalt concrete pathways, conduit and pole bases for future lighting, synthetic turf and landscaping.
