Purpose of Agenda Item: This Ordinance authorizes the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to enter into a grant agreement with Hacienda Community Development Corporation to place a community funded solar electric system on the roof of the Fustal Court at the Ortiz Center at 6736 NE Killingsworth Street.
- 6. History of Agenda Item/Background: BPS has engaged in various efforts over the past several years to increase the adoption of solar energy technologies and to transform the market for solar in Portland and beyond. Working with partners, BPS has provided outreach and education, zoning code changes, and technical support for neighborhood-driven campaigns for purchasing solar panels (Solarize Portland). These efforts have significantly spurred the installation of solar on residential and business properties. Installed photovoltaic (PV) capacity in Portland is now close to 15 megawatts.

However, installation and direct ownership of on-site solar remains out of reach for many Portlanders for a variety of reasons, including site ownership, financial commitment, and solar resource constraints such as shading or roof orientation. Community solar represents a



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new addition to Portland's tools for transforming the local market for solar energy. Community solar is intended to make participation in the installation of PV systems available and accessible to a wider, more diverse audience of Portlanders, including renters, homeowners with shaded properties, and those wanting to fund PV in smaller increments than a typical residential system.

On May 15, 2013, through Ordinance No. 186029, City Council authorized BPS to accept a grant in the amount of \$100,000 from the Oregon Community Foundation's Penstemon Fund for community-based efforts to increase renewable energy generation and to seed a revolving fund for solar on public facilities.

On October 23, 2013, through Ordinance No. 186295, City Council authorized the creation of the Community Solar Special Revenue Fund to support the Solar Forward Program in the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability.

The Community Solar Special Revenue Fund receives revenue from Portland General Electric, a 15-year stream of utility incentive payments based on the energy produced from the solar energy system installed at Southwest Community Center (funded through PGE's Solar Payment Option program) and community and business donations to fund the installation of solar electric systems on other publicly-owned facilities. No General Funds will be involved in funding these solar installations.

BPS and Hacienda CDC will partner on a community-supported solar project on the roof of the Futsal Court at the Ortiz Center to help fulfill objectives Oregon Community Foundation's grant agreement and the intention of the Solar Forward fund.

7. What individuals or groups are or would be supportive or opposed to this action? Opposed: None.

Supportive: Solar Oregon, Hacienda CDC Stakeholders, Portland Public Schools and other renewable energy and environmental advocacy groups.

8. How does this relate to current City policies?

This agreement will enable the installation of solar, a renewable energy resource. Since 1990, with Ordinance 162975, the City has had a stated policy to "support environmentally acceptable, sustainable energy sources, especially renewable resources such as solar." Resolution 36748, the joint City of Portland/Multnomah County Climate Action Plan, calls for accelerated transition to renewable energy like solar. In addition, Resolution 36714, the City's five-year Economic Development Strategy adopted in 2009, identifies solar as a key opportunity within the Clean Tech and Sustainable Industries cluster.
