7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The City presently owns approximately 55,000 streetlights. Of that total, 4,318 streetlights are on utility-owned streetlight-only poles and the City has been leasing these poles from PGE. As part of new tariff requirements, the City will no longer be leasing these poles but is now required to own them and their associated circuits.

The bureau has determined that it is necessary to purchase street light poles and associated circuits from PGE for the project for a total not to exceed \$1,300,000. Portland General Electric Company (PGE) is a privately-owned electrical utility company regulated in the State of Oregon. The purchase of regulated goods and services, utilities, and utility regulated services are allowed as a Special Procurement under City Code 5.33.220.D.14.
