### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

City Code Chapters 20.24 and 20.28 both refer to assets that are no longer within the purview of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation.

Chapter 20.24, Portland Zoo Admission Charges, addresses matters relating to admission fee rates and discounts for the Portland Zoo (now Oregon Zoo). In 1977, City Council transferred ownership responsibilities for the Portland Zoo to Metro.

Chapter 20.28, Rental Charges for Civic Stadium, addresses matters relating to rental charges, insurance coverage, restriction on use, and collection of rentals relating to Civic Stadium (now Providence Park). Parks no longer operates the stadium, with current operations being performed by Peregrine Sports, LLC, through an operating agreement with the Office of Management and Finance.

Because both chapters refer to outdated ownership responsibilities and operating arrangements, Chapter 20.24 and Chapter 20.28 should each be repealed. These changes were reviewed and approved by the Bureau of Parks and Recreation.

### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no financial impact in repealing these City Code chapters. This ordinance simply updates City Code to reflect current ownership and operations responsibilities for both facilities.

#### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

The CAO recommends that Council adopt the ordinance to amend City Code.
