a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

Council passage of this Resolution will provide new street, sidewalk and stormwater improvements on SW 45th Avenue, SW California Street and SW Vermont Street, including a new southbound bike lane on SW 45th Avenue. The LID will fulfill conditions of an amended street vacation for SW 46th Avenue & Florida Street previously approved by Council on February 29, 2012.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Outreach has been made to owners of property abutting the planned improvements; to SWNI, the Maplewood Neighborhood Association, SW Trails, the Pedestrian Advisory Committee, Oregon Walks and the Bicycle Transportation Alliance.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The LID will facilitate construction of improvements desired by the community per testimony with the original SW 46th & Florida street vacation in 2012. St. Luke Church is funding the planned improvements, and has endeavored to be responsive to community concerns, both in terms of funding this LID (including voluntarily absorbing what otherwise would be neighboring properties' assessments) and supporting the amended SW 46th & Florida Street vacation ordinance.

10) Is any future public involvement anticipated or necessary for this Council item? Please describe why or why not?

This Council agenda item is the successful result of prior outreach, resulting in 100% petition support. Council passage of the concurrent amended street vacation ordinance will reaffirm Council's prior decision that the east-west pedestrian connection will be aligned with the SW California Street right-of-way to the south in lieu of the SW Florida Street right-of-way to the north; however additional outreach will be made on the details of the pending 15' right-of-way dedication by St. Luke west of the existing western terminus of SW California Street, which is not proposed to be vacated.
