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The only costs associated with Streamlining are 1 FTE (Water Resources Program Manager), and a small occasional PTE contract (approx.. \$5000). The Streamlining Program is housed within the Bureau of Environmental Services, its biggest user, and is financed primarily by BES. The Water Bureau contributes \$40,000 annual. Prior to 2009, General Funds also contributed to the Streamlining Program to pay for the general fund bureaus' use, such as Parks and Fire. Portland Development Commission contributed until

2011 and PBOT contributed until 2012. As a result of budget cuts, the Streamlining Program is now a fee for service program for bureaus except for BES and Water.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

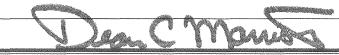
