I also understand that the train cars that are built for gases have an expiration date for safety and that date has now passed. Those cars have not been replaced.

One of the many details we should look into whenever we consider bringing fossil fuel through Portland and along the Columbia River.

As part of the conversation about the propane terminal in Portland, I would like you to view a video with footage of a propane explosion that gives more credence to the concerns of Portland citizens along the rail route, the Oregon Slough, and Hayden
