PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Faubion School and Concordia University have been neighbors in education for 63 years, sharing 24 adjacent acres in Northeast Portland.

Dr. Nancy Golden, Chief Education Officer to Oregon Governor John Kitzhaber Voters approved a Portland Public Schools (PPS) capital improvement bond in November 2012. PPS is Oregon's largest district with over 48,000 students. Faubion School was the only elementary school slated for rebuild because of the private, nonprofit partnership with Concordia University-Portland.

The two educational facilities will co-build the first 3-PhD[™] campus in the nation, which will serve nearly 800 PK-8 children, 81% of whom are eligible to receive free and reduced lunch. Concordia's College of Education will be located inside the school, preparing future educators within a diverse, urban and low-income school.

WHAT IS 3 to PhD™?

3 to PhD[™] is a trailblazing educational model to create safer, healthier and more educated communities from early learning through Pursuing one's Highest Dreams (PhD). The goal is to close the opportunity gap for the most vulnerable children and families.

3 to PhD[™] restores school as the heartbeat of a community and includes: wrap-around services for children and families, early childhood education, health & wellness programs, STEAM (science, technology engineering, arts and math) educational opportunities, and one-on-one tutors, mentors and coaches from Concordia.

Along with board member Carl Talton, we'll present 3 to PhD.

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3to PhD is a unique capital and programmatic partnership between Portland Public Schools' Faubion School and Concordia University. It is designed to create a safer, healthier and more educated community in N/NE Portland. Leveraging seven years of programmatic partnership between Faubion and CU that has elevated literacy levels, improved middle school reading, science and math scores, addressed health issues, and significantly reduced disciplinary issues at recess, this new model of collaboration will embed Oregon's largest College of Education within a completely new Faubion School while also providing extensive wrap-around services including low-cost access to organic food and a health clinic. The capital components also include a comprehensive early childhood center and extensive STEAM facilities – Science, technology, Engineering, Art and Math. Total capital costs are \$43M including CU's \$15.51M portion which is in the fund development phase. PPS's \$27.5M contribution comes the successful November 2012 capital Bond Measure. CU's portion will include the health and wellness area, food club, STEAM facilities and the entire early childhood development center as well as CU classroom, offices and related spaces for the College of Education. Many of those spaces, including faculty offices and classrooms, are distributed throughout the most secure areas of the facility. The College of Education's Dean's office is collocated with the Principal's office. 3 to PhD presents a new teacher preparation model that emulates the practical approach embodied in the hospital teaching model used to prepare physicians. The City has made an initial commitment of \$100,000 and an additional \$400,000 is requested.
