

Local Stimulus: Progress Report


- Fast-tracked \$283M of projects
 - Completed 56% of total 2-year goal
 - 31% cost savings: City expended \$216M
- Acted quickly to benefit local businesses
 - Streamlined permitting processes
 - Passed Locally Based Enterprise (LBE)
 - Reconstituted Fair Contracting and Employment forum
 - Increased support within PDC for small businesses
- Lifted the cap on TOD incentive program
- Encouraged new private development


Local Stimulus: Investments to Date

Value of Investments by Location







Local Stimulus: Results of Investments

- Direct & indirect jobs related to local stimulus estimated at 2,592*
 - Evaluation of direct job creation in process
- Average wages paid on City projects
 - Carpenters \$44.62
 - Cement Mason \$41.63
 - Electricians \$50.02
 - Laborers \$35.81
 - Operators \$47.12
 - Truck Drivers \$24.39
 - Welders \$41.63

^{*} Calculated using ODOT's assumption of 14 direct and indirect jobs per million dollars of investment
