Since 1923 Sunshine Division has been providing emergency food and clothing relief to Portland families and individuals in need. We serve Portland's most vulnerable populations: families with children, seniors, the disabled, and veterans as they face economic challenges to meet basic needs.

An independent charity in unique partnership with the Portland Police Bureau, we operate year round, receiving and distributing 1,200 tons of food annually. In addition to the over 12,000 households we serve directly through our doors each year, Sunshine Division donates food to over 17 food-relief charities in five surrounding counties.

The Sunshine Division distributes new and gently-used clothing through our Threadz clothing store and new clothing through the Izzy's Kids program, which pairs police officers with low-income students for a school clothes shopping trip.

The Portland Schools Foundation mobilizes the ideas, leadership, political support, and money necessary to ensure a world-class education for every child, in every public school, in every Portland neighborhood. Serving 77,600 students in 141 schools in Portland's five school districts, PSF supports fundraising at the local school level, provides funding to Portland's neediest schools, engages the community in school issues, and leads coalition efforts such as Connected by 25 and Ninth Grade Counts to reduce the local drop out rate and ensure success for every youth.

Funds received through the City of Portland workplace giving program are distributed on a per capita basis to the five participating districts (Portland Public Schools, Parkrose, Centennial, David Douglas and Reynolds).
