# 2015 Charitable Campaign Wednesday, October 15, 2014 9:30 a.m. City Council

Good morning Mayor and members of Council. I am Kelly Ball from the OMF Business Operations Division and I'm joined by Karyl Whelan, the City's staff to the Charitable Campaign.

#### Ordinance:

- Authorizes charitable organizations eligible to participate in the City's 2015 Charitable Campaign;
- Authorizes exemptions from the umbrella requirement (meaning they give funding to at least 9 other non-profits) for Portland Parks Foundation and for Portland Toy & Joymakers.

## General Campaign Information:

- ➤ Kickoff: October 29, 8:45 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. in the City Hall North Atrium. Eastside KickOff on October 30 at 6:30 a.m. Campaign runs for two weeks until November 13.

- > The OMF Business Operations Division organizes the campaign, with the help of 37 bureau representatives.
- > The Campaign began in 1989.
- Campaign administrative costs are funded by the umbrella charities. Following the close of each campaign, each umbrella charity is billed based on the percentage of donations they received. So if a charity got 8% of employee donations, they would receive 8% of the bill for administration costs.

### Participating Charities:

- ➤ 15 umbrella organizations are participating this year. In all 495 charities are represented. Donations may also be made to US 501(c)(3) charities that are not represented via write-in.
- ➤ The charities represent a wide range of program areas such as the environment, education, arts and humanities, equity, social welfare, social justice, animal welfare, health and medicine, and spirituality.
- > The charities are local, national and international. International donations are made through the US 501(c)(3) umbrella organizations.

### Last Year's Participation:

- > 479 employees participated last year.
- ➤ Nearly \$250,000 (\$248,506) was donated last year. Over \$1.3 million dollars total have been donated over the last five years.
- > \$519 was the average donation.
- United Way received the most donations with more than \$39,000 donated (\$39,761).
- Last year's participation was down. This year we will be working with bureau reps to increase awareness in their bureaus. We also plan to improve participation with a coordinated messaging campaign to remind employees how effective their donations are and how easy it is to donate.

#### Donations:

- > Employees have the option of donating via payroll deduction, or by credit card or writing a check. Donations can be made online or with a paper form.
- ➤ Regular City employees can donate one lump sum or they can space their donations evenly over each pay period 26 pay periods in all. Employees with the PDC can also donate in one lump sum or space their donations evenly over 12 pay periods.
- ➤ There is no minimum or maximum limit on how much an employee may donate.
- Donations are not made pretax, but employees will receive a dollar-for-dollar deduction at tax time.
- All employees who provide their name and address on the pledge form will receive a tax receipt from the umbrella charity and an acknowledgment from the affiliated charity as well.
