- SE Transportation Hub: Connects light rail, streetcar loop. ous lines, regional trail, OMSI, and PCC. SE 82nd: With an expanding PCC campus and zoned for
- sive multi-use development, this area is the site of a Portland Development Commission (PDC) Neighborhood Prosperity Initiative (NPI) Urban Renewal Plan to foster conomic opportunity and neighborhood vitality.
- SE 122nd: A Major Transit Priority Street and a major city raffic street, 122nd is targeted for pedestrian and other streetscape improvements to serve the adjoining residential neighborhoods and commercial areas, and is also the site of a PDC NPI.
- SE 182nd: With its close proximity to Gresham's Downto and the Rockwood Neighborhood, this is one of 10 key regional focus areas for TriMet's pedestrian Network Analysis
