

ORDINANCE NO. 72891

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Pacific International Livestock Exposition, Inc., 804 Wilcox Building, to fasten and maintain decorations on the ornamental light posts on certain downtown streets in Portland between the dates of October 2 and October 14, 1939, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that a written application has been received from the Pacific International Livestock Exposition, Inc. requesting permission to fasten and maintain decorations on the ornamental light posts on certain downtown streets for the purpose of advertising its 1939 livestock show. The Council further finds that the Pacific International Livestock Exposition, Inc. has submitted a proposed plan for the said decorations which has been approved by the representatives of the Portland General Electric Co. and the Northwestern Electric Co. and by the City Engineer. The said application states that the proposed decorating shall be let to an Oregon corporation, and it appearing to the Council that this annualInternational Livestock Show is a matter of civic interest; therefore, a revocable permit is hereby granted to the Pacific International Livestock Exposition, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the grantee) to fasten and maintain decorations on the ornamental light posts in the streets within the district bounded by the east line of S.W. 4th Ave., the south line of S.W. Salmon St., the west line of S.W. 10th Ave., and the north line of S.W. Oak St., said decorations to be erected on or after October 2, 1939, and removed from the ornamental light posts on or before October 14, 1939.

The said decorations are to be designed and constructed as shown on the attached plan approved by the Portland General Electric Company, the Northwestern Electric Company and the Gity Engineer, and marked Exhibit "A", and made a part of this ordinance, and shall be securely fastened and maintained on the ornamental light posts in the position and manner shown on said sketch.

This permit is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Council, and no expenditure of money hereunder, or lapse of time, or other act or thing shall operate as an entoppel against the City of Portland, or be held to give the grantee any vested or other right.

Upon revocation, the grantee shall immediately remove said decorations from the street area as required by and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer. The permit herein authorized shall not become effective until the grantee shall have filed with the City Auditor in the form approved by the City Attorney of the City of Portland, Oregon, a good and substantial bond or insurance policy in the sum of \$25,000.00 general liability for property damage and \$15,000.00 and \$30,000.00 general liability for personal injury.

The grantee shall further covenant and agree to hold the City of Portland, the City Engineer, and each and all of the officers and employees of said City blameless from any injury to persons or property.

This permit shall not become effective until the grantee shall have filed with the City Auditor of the City of Portland, Oregon, a document satisfactory to the City Attorney accepting the terms and conditions hereof.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Fortland in this: In order that the type of decorations may be approved so that construction may begin without undue delay; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
