ORDINANCE No. 187509

Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County Drainage District No. 1, Peninsula Drainage District 1, and Peninsula Drainage District 2 for an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for flow management in the Columbia Slough (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

- Section 1. The Council finds:
 - 1. The Columbia Slough has been identified by the State of Oregon, in accordance with the Federal Clean Water Act, as a water quality limited water body.
 - 2. Improving the water quality to provide for and protect beneficial uses in the Columbia Slough are goals set forth in the *Portland Watershed Management Plan* adopted by the Portland's City Council on March 8, 2006.
 - 3. This IGA is designed to help facilitate compliance with the Clean Water Act and support the *Total Maximum Daily Load Implementation Plan* by reducing water temperatures in the Columbia Slough.
 - 4. Managing water levels and flow of the Upper and Middle Columbia Slough during the summer months can improve water quality by discouraging algal and macrophyte (aquatic plants) growth and increasing cool groundwater inflow.
 - 5. To successfully accomplish this project, Multnomah County Drainage District No. 1, Peninsula Drainage District No. 1, and Peninsula Drainage District No. 2 (collectively referred to as Drainage Districts) will provide in-kind services by operating Pump Stations No. 1 and No. 4.
 - 6. The established cost is \$100,000. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2016 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESWS000008. Additional funding for fiscal years 2017 through 2020 will be requested in future annual budget processes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Drainage Districts for the purposes described in the Statement of Work.
- b. This Intergovernmental Agreement will be retroactive to July 1, 2015.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
