

## IMPACT STATEMENT

**Legislation title:** Authorize a participating agreement with U.S. Bank National Association for fleet credit card services for a not to exceed amount of \$4,250,000 for five years. (Procurement Report - Bid Notice #00000180)

### **Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:**

The purpose of this legislation is to authorize a participating agreement in order to provide fleet credit card services primarily for emergency responders to access non-City fuel sites in the event of an emergency or when in an area without access to City of Portland operated fuel sites.

On October 28, 2015, City Council passed Ordinance No. 187401 authorizing the purchase of approximately 250,000 external gallons of motor fuel for City of Portland vehicles for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$850,000 per year.

In accordance with City Code 5.33.140 the City may participate in Cooperative Procurements, without further competition, in order to establish Price Agreements for the acquisition of Goods or Services. Under this authority the contracting agency must have used a source selection method substantially equivalent to those in PCC Sections 5.33.200 or 5.33.210.

Procurement Services recommends award of a participating agreement to U.S. Bank National Association, under the Western States Contracting Alliance - National Association of State Procurement Officials (WSCA-NASPO) cooperative agreement as awarded by the State of Oregon through participating addendum #4706.

This legislation does not change any City policies.

No revenues will be impacted by this legislation.

### **Financial and budgetary impacts:**

Funding for purchases will come from the approved budgets of City bureaus.

No present positions will be created, eliminated or re-classified as a result of this legislation.

### **Community impacts and community involvement:**

The contracting community was initially involved when the solicitation was posted on the State of Oregon's ORPIN website on behalf of the Western States Contracting Alliance. Further, the goods and services contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women and emerging small businesses became involved when this project was advertised and publically noticed on the City's Online Procurement System on November 24, 2015, as required by City Code 5.33.160.

No known persons or groups will be testifying.

No future public involvement is anticipated or necessary for this request as these goods and services will be used on internal City equipment.
