Project purpose

Part 1 - Minimum Parking

- Better align district with citywide parking requirements
- Off-street parking supply in parking-scarce area
- Part 2 Accessory as Commercial Parking
- Provide opportunities to efficiently use limited and existing parking resources









Part 1 - Minimum Parking

History

- From 1991 to 2013 most of city had no minimum parking required for multi-dwelling development in some commercial zones and close to transit.
- Prior to 2003 NW plan district area had the same minimums as citywide
- 2003 NW Plan District no minimum parking required
- 2013 citywide new minimum parking requirements for development with more than 30 units. Plan districts not included



Proposed code changes

Part 1 - Minimum Parking

- Minimum household living parking requirements for multi-dwelling development >30 units.
 - 31 to 40 units would require .20 spaces per unit;
 - 41 to 50 units would require .25 spaces per unit
 - 51 or more units would require .33 spaces per unit
- Exceptions to the minimum number of parking spaces







Proposed code changes

Part 2 - Accessory Parking as Commercial Parking

Proposed Changes

- Update review body and general language
- Create more flexibility expand allowed users and allow short-term parking
- Code as framework, with administrative details in a PBOT Administrative Rule
