Whereas, stable and adequate ongoing funding for the Bureau of Emergency Communications is critical to support the work of our public safety communicators, who often work long hours to ensure the Bureau fulfills its mission of answering 9-1-1 calls and dispatching help; and

Whereas, telecommunicators in the Bureau of Emergency Communications exhibit compassion, understanding, and professionalism while performing a critically important job as Multnomah County's first firstresponders;
