## Portland's Garbage, Recycling & Compost Collection System

#### "Commercial"

(Businesses and multifamily properties ≥5 units)

- Customers choose their hauler
- City administers rules, assists businesses
- City receives per-ton fee

#### "Residential curbside"

(single house up to four-plex)

- Haulers serve geographic territories through franchise system
- City sets rates, administers rules, assists residents
- City receives franchise fee (percent of revenue)



## **Residential Rates: Key Cost Factors**

- Labor and fuel costs as adjusted for inflation
- Garbage disposal costs (can weights and tip fees)
- Yard debris/food scraps tip fees
- Recyclable material sales revenue
- Incentives/disincentives
