ORDINANCE NO. 128055

An Ordinance to amend Section 3-323, Bureau of Municipal Auditorium, Section 3-411, Record of Daily Arrests, Section 3-1403, Form of Oath for Other Officer or Employe, Section 3-1611, Compensation for Ushers and Others at Public Auditorium, and to repeal Section 3-509, Battalion Chiefs Placed Under Two Platoon Provisions, of Ordinance No. 77780, the Administration Code, to correct inconsistencies.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that the Auditorium is now officially known as the Civic Auditorium, and in various ordinances and codes, it is referred to as the Public Auditorium or Municipal Auditorium as well as Civic Auditorium, and that the same should be corrected; now, therefore, Section 3-323, Bureau of Municipal Auditorium, of Ordinance No. 77780, the Administration Code, passed by the Council September 3, 1942, as amended, hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 3-323. BUREAU OF CIVIC AUDITORIUM.

The Bureau of <u>Civic</u> Auditorium shall consist of the manager of the <u>Civic</u> Auditorium who shall be in charge and such other employes as may be provided by the Council. This bureau shall have jurisdiction over the upkeep, operation, and repair of the Civic Auditorium.

Section 2. The Council finds that Section 3-411, Record of Daily Arrests, of the said Ordinance, fails to properly identify the Commissioner in charge; now, therefore, the said Section hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 3-411. RECORD OF DAILY ARRESTS.

The bureau of police shall keep a daily arrest docket and a municipal court transcript in substantially the following form:

The arrest docket may be printed in any size as may be determined by the chief of police and shall be a part of the original records of the bureau of police and shall be preserved and kept in the custody of the bureau of police.

Section 3. The Council finds that Section 3-1403, Form of Oath for Other Officer or Employe, of the said Ordinance, does not provide that the Auditor should take the Form of Oath prescribed in Section 3-1402, and not the Form of Oath for Other Employes; now, therefore, Section 3-1403, Form of Oath for Other Officer or Employe, of the said Ordinance hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 3-1403. FORM OF OATH FOR OTHER OFFICER OR EMPLOYE.

The form of oath to be taken by the officer or employe of the city of Portland, when required, other than mayor, commissioner and auditor, shall be substantially as follows:

Section 4. The Council finds that Section 3-1611, Compensation for Ushers and Others at Public Auditorium, of said Ordinance, again refers to the auditorium other than as the Civic Auditorium; now, therefore, Section 3-1611, Compensation for Ushers and Others at Public Auditorium of the said Ordinance, hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 3-1611. COMPENSATION FOR USHERS AND OTHERS AT CIVIC AUDITORIUM.

ORDINANCE No.

The rate of pay for ushers, doormen and ticket sellers at the <u>Civic</u> Auditorium shall be as fixed from time to time by the Council. The number of such ushers, doormen and ticket sellers shall be according to the needs for each occasion as determined by the Auditorium Manager and the length of time for the service on each occasion shall also be determined by the Manager as the occasion requires. The Manager shall have power, subject to the approval of the Commissioner in charge, to engage the services of all necessary personnel. This section shall be applicable only in cases where the compensation of such personnel is to be paid from City funds. The person employed for said purposes shall be included on the regular payroll and paid as other services in connection with the <u>Civic</u> Auditorium.

Section 5. The Council finds that Section 3-4104, Repair, of the said Ordinance contains a reference to the Bureau of Transportation and Maintenance Repair Shop, and a reference to Section 4-1101 of the Finance Code, which section has been repealed; now, therefore, Section 3-4104, Repair, of the said Ordinance, hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 3-4104. REPAIR.

Every city-owned motor vehicle damaged as defined in subsection (1) of Section 3-4101 shall be removed to the <u>Municipal</u> Shop for repairs as soon as conveniently possible following the accident, but in no event more than seven (7) days thereafter; provided, however, (1) that no vehicle shall be repaired without prior authorization of the Commissioner in charge of the bureau to which the vehicle is assigned, or his authorized representative, except in the event of emergency whereupon the said Commissioner shall be notified within 72 hours of all such work done and (2) in no event shall any vehicle be repaired by other than a city-owned and operated repair shop unless and until the Purchasing Agent of the City shall have first obtained at least three (3) independent estimates of cost of repair, and in such event the repair work shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.

Section 6. The Council finds that Section 3-509, Battalion Chiefs Placed Under Two Platoon Provisions, of said Ordinance, is no longer in effect in the Bureau of Fire in as much as the Battalion Chiefs are under the regular 56 hour provisions; now, therefore, Section 3-509, Battalion Chiefs Placed Under Two Platoon Pro-Passed by the Council, visions, of said Ordinance hereby is repealed.
