AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this day of 1971, by and between CITY OF PORTLAND, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, by and through its Mayor and its Commissioner of Public Affairs, hereinafter called CITY, and the PORTLAND ZOOLOGICAL SOCIETY, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Oregon, hereinafter called SOCIETY,

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the CITY is the owner of certain animals, birds, reptiles, and fish used for zoological exhi ition purposes, and certain real property and buildings situated thereon which are used exclusively for zoological exhibition purposes, known as the PORTLAND ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS, hereinafter called ZOO, and

WHEREAS the SOCIETY is composed of persons interested in bettering the present zoological exhibits and grounds, is capable of raising funds for this purpose, and is desirous of assuming the care, maintenance, and custody of the CITY'S above-referred to animals, birds, reptiles, fish, and the buildings and grounds strictly within the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and

WHEREAS the CITY and SOCIETY both feel that the ZOO should be operated, maintained, and developed primarily for the enjoyment and education of the citizenry at large and that to the fullest extent possible all citizens will be encouraged to utilize the facilities and programs of the ZOO,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual agreements of the CITY and SOCIETY hereto and hereinafter set forth, and for the sum of ONE AND NO/100 DOLLAR (\$1.00) by each to the other in hand paid, receipt of which hereby is acknowledged, the CITY and SOCIETY mutual agree as follows:

1. The CITY hereby consents and agrees and does hereby allow the SOCIETY to assume responsibility for custody, care, maintenance, and development of its zoological animals, birds, reptiles, fish and the grounds and buildings housing the same, including the tracks, trestles and structures comprising the ZOO Railway, and the machinery, supplies and equipment used in the operation and maintenance of ZOO including the locomotives and cars used in the operation of said ZOO Railway, and all of these premises known as the PORTLAND ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS and hereinbelow described, and to display said animals, birds, reptiles, and fish, and operate and manage said grounds and buildings

Page 1 - Agreement June 3, 1971 EB:w - MCR:pm for uses and purposes as a public zoological park, and for public education, and recreational purposes. Said animals, birds, reptiles, and fish as of the date hereof are described in Exhibit "A," which machinery, supplies and equipment are described in Exhibit "B," which Exhibits are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

The grounds and premises covered by this agreement and referred to herein as Z00 are located in Portland, Multnomah County, State of Oregon, and are more particularly described as follows, to wit:

The entire Z00 area as indicate by the area enclosed within boundaries marked in red on Exhibit "C," which Exhibit is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, and in addition thereto and outside of said boundaries the existing Z00 railroad line along with a twenty foot right of way along the entire route and distance of such railroad line and the entire Washington Park Terminal with present access thereto.

2. The CITY hereby consents and agrees that the SOCIETY shall have the exclusive privilege of operating and shall operate all concessions within the ZOO. No concession may be subcontracted without approval by the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks and approval of any bonds and insurance policies by the City Attorney.

The SOCIETY agrees:

- (a) That the grounds above described and the buildings located thereupon only shall be used by it for a public zoological park with related educational, conservation, research, and recreational uses and purposes.
- (b) To hold, manage, operate, and develop the Z00 including both the grounds, buildings, equipment, and zoological collection as will best serve the interests of the public and of the CITY and to keep said grounds in a suitable and proper condition, and further agrees to make no capital improvement or alteration to the grounds or buildings above described at a cost in excess of \$5,000 therefor without first receiving approval from the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks, before so proceeding with such improvements or alterations. The SOCIETY shall maintain all classes of exhibits and physical facilities at the same or better level as in existence at the Z00 on July 1,1971, and shall not abandon any such classes or substantially alter the use of facilities unless first approved by the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks.

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- (c) To efficiently and properly care for, feed, supervise, and maintain all of the animals, birds, reptiles, and fish in said 200 in a recognized proper manner, and to keep said ZOO open at all reasonable hours for the use of the public, and to keep said animals on exhibition therein during such reasonable hours. Said SOCIETY may provide for free admissions and may charge admission fees to said grounds but not to exceed 75¢ for adults and 35¢ for children, and fees for passage on the 200 railroad, varying such fees for persons at any age, group, or class of the public, or days as it may determine, subject to approval by the CITY. The CITY and SOCIETY jointly recognize the desirability of a single admission fee for all of the Zoological Gardens including the Children's 700, and SOCIETY agrees to work to that end. The CITY and the OCIETY also jointly recognize the existence of budgeting pressures on the CITY and SOCIETY and agree to work toward eventual stabilization or reduction of general fund tax support to the Zoological Gardens as may be mutually agreed.
- (d) To operate all concessions in a careful, efficient manner, utilizing good business practices, in order that a reasonable return may be realized from the operation while providing good quality service to the ZOO visitors. The SOCIETY shall establish the price and quality of all goods and services provided by it in connection with this agreement. However, the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks, or his authorized representative, may review such prices and quality of goods and may set a price or quality different from that established by the SOCIETY. The SOCIETY may appreal any such change of price or quality to the City Council.
- (e) To determine what living creatures shall comprise the zoological collection to be maintained and developed at the said Z00, and from time to time, recommend to the CITY the sale, exchange, or disposal of a part of said collection as now or hereafter constituted for reasonable consideration, and to make additions thereto by purchase or acceptance of gifts or loans of living creatures for zoological purposes or by exchange as hereinbefore described, and to keep an inventory of all animals, birds, reptiles, and fish in the Z00, which inventory shall be made available to the CITY at all reasonable times and reported annually to the City Auditor.
- (f) To recommend rules and regulations consistent with the intent and purpose of this agreement, but rules and regulations concerning conduct of the visiting public shall be promulgated by the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks.
- (g) To pay for all utilities and other services as well as for the upkeep of the grounds and buildings comprising the 200, and to make any and all necessary repairs so that the grounds,

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buildings, pens, cages, pits, and other structures now located in the 200 shall at all times be in an equal or better state of repair than they are at the date of the signing of this agreement, and further agrees to deliver up to the CITY at the termination of this agreement all equipment, machinery, buildings, pens, cages, pits, and other structures, and the grounds in as good condition as they are at the signing of this agreement, subject to normal wear and deterioration, together with all additions made to the zoological collection and grounds during the life of this agreement; PROVIDED, however, that the SOCIETY'S obligations of maintenance and repair of damages resulting from land movement shall be limited to a maximum of \$2,000 in any one year. CITY solid waste disposal facilitie, including land fill, presently used by the ZOO shall continue to be available for use at no additional fee to the SOCIETY. CITY will supply to the SOCIETY such equipment, materials, supplies and commodities as the SOCIETY may order in writing, subject to CITY'S ability to obtain the same; the CITY'S cost including overhead allowance as provided in the Code of the City of Portland, Oregon, shall be an offset against the instalment payment next due to be paid by CITY to the SOCIETY under paragraph 4(i) of this agreement.

- (h) To keep and use all funds coming into its possession solely for the purpose of the operation, management, and development of the ZOO, in accordance with the terms of this agreement, and to file an annual report with the CITY on or before March 1 of each year for the preceding calendar year, and to file supplemental monthly reports, which reports shall cover, as requested, the management, operations, and development of the ZOO, and shall also contain a source summary of all receipts and disbursements as of the date of said report supported by the annual audit of a certified public accountant. The SOCIETY further agrees to keep accurate and sufficient records and that the CITY, at any time, through its duly authorized representatives, may examine the records kept by the SOCIETY with respect to the management, operations, and development of the ZOO, including all receipts and disbursements of the SOCIETY.
- (i) To furnish and maintain such public liability insurance, including property damage, as will protect the SOCIETY and the CITY from all claims for damage or personal injury, including death, which may arise from operations under this agreement, or in connection therewith; such insurance shall provide coverage for not less than \$200,000 for personal injury to each claimant, \$1,000,000 for each occasion involving personal injury, and \$25,000 to each claimant and \$300,000 for each accident for property damage. Such insurance shall be without prejudice to coverage otherwise existing and shall name as additional insureds, the CITY OF PORTLAND, its officers and employes, and all members, officers, trustees, and employes of the SOCIETY, shall contain a crossliability clause and shall further provide that such policy

shall not terminate or be cancelled prior to termination of this agreement without first giving thirty (30) days' written notice to the Auditor of the CITY, and such policy shall be subject to the approval of the City Attorney.

- (j) To insure the ZOO equipment and improvements against physical loss or damage in an amount not less than full value.
- To accept in its employ all of those persons presently employed in the operation of the ZOO by the CITY (whose names are listed in the attached Exhibit "D") who wish to transfer to the SOCIETY, and to provide such employes for their period of employment by the SOCIETY with wages, sick pay, holidays, medical insurance, life insurance, jury duty leave, military leave, retirement and vacation benefits equivalent to or better than those enjoyed by said employes at the date hereof. Those who do not wish to transfer to the employ of SOCIETY shall, subject to available positions, be afforded the opportunity of other employment with the CITY. As to those employes who do not wish to transfer to the employ of the SOCIETY and for whom no position is available at the effective date of this agreement, the CITY agrees to treat such employes as being on layoff status, even though employed by the SOCIETY, for purposes of employment by the CITY as a position of comparable pay becomes available. As to those CITY employes who wish to transfer to the SOCIETY and do so, their employment may be terminated only for cause.

As to any CITY employe who transfers to the SOCIETY'S employment and elects to withdraw the moneys in his fund under the Public Employes Retirement System, the SOCIETY'S obligation shall be to provide a retirement plan relating only to such employe's future service with the SOCIETY but with said accumulation of benefits to be at a rate and level equivalent to or better than the present Public Employes' plan under which such employes are covered. As to any CITY employe who transfers to the employment of the SOCIETY and elects to leave his moneys in the Public Employes Retirement Fund, the SOCIETY shall obligated to provide a retirement program which will pay to each employe upon retirement an amount or amounts which, when added to the amount or amounts received by said employe from the State Fund, shall equal or better the amount which the employe would have received if his employment with the SOCIETY had been covered by such State System. The CITY hereby agrees to grant CITY employes who transfer to employment by the SOCIETY a leave of absence of not less than four (4) years from July 1, 1971. The CITY and the SOCIETY, working in consultation with the bargaining representative or representatives of the employes involved, agree to propose legislation which will implement preservation of State Fund retirement

Page 5 - Agreement June 3, 1971 EB:w - MCR:pm and pension benefits of CITY employes as of the date they become employes of the SOCIETY or, alternatively, to permit SOCIETY employes under this agreement to continue participation under the State Fund. Upon enactment of such legislation, SOCIETY agrees that each CITY employe will be continued in the Public Employes Retirement System without option to withdraw the moneys in his fund.

- (1) To set aside for capital improvements not less than ten percent (10%) of all receipts for gate admission to the ZOO premises, provided, however, that SOCIETY may use such receipts for operating expenses to the extent that it replaces funds so used with equal amounts raised from other sources plus normal commercial interest. Compliance with this proviso shall be determined upon the basis of an average over the term of this contract.
- (m) To exercise its best efforts to raise funds by public subscription and contribution and from such other sources as may become available to it, all for the purpose of making improvements to the ZOO including the purchase of specimens for public exhibit.
- (n) To amend its bylaws for a period ending not sooner than June 30, 1972, to provide for an executive management committee to operate and manage the ZOO on behalf of the SOCIETY for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and to consist of seven members who shall be members of the Board of Trustees of the SOCIETY or appointed as regular members of the Board, one of whom shall be the president of the SOCIETY and chairman of said committee, two of whom shall be the first and second vice presidents of the SOCIETY, three of whom shall be appointed by the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks of the CITY and confirmed by the Council and the seventh of whom shall be appointed jointly by the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks of the CITY and the Board of Trustees of the SOCIETY.
- (o) To employ an executive director with suitable professional qualifications who shall be responsible for management of the total ZOO operation and overall organization and direction of all personnel. Such executive director shall be employed and shall assume his responsibilities on or before the effective date of this agreement and shall report to the Executive Management Committee of the SOCIETY, or to the Board of Trustees of the SOCIETY, as the case may be.
- (p) That no research shall be conducted on the ZOO animals that is inhumane or of a vivisectional nature; only those kinds of research shall be permitted which are consistent with the standards established by the SOCIETY and approved by the Council. All records maintained by the SOCIETY with respect to

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such research shall be made readily available for inspection to the CITY and its authorized representative.

- 4. It is mutually agreed by the parties hereto as follows:
- (a) That title to all animals, birds, reptiles and fish hereafter acquired by the SOCIETY by purchase or donation for exhibition purposes in the ZOO, and to all buildings, additions, alterations, or other improvements of every kind, nature, or description placed upon the above-described grounds comprising the ZOO or other assets earned as a result of this agreement by the SOCIETY during the full term of this lease agreement shall immediately vest in CITY, and shall be praceably delivered to CITY by the SOCIETY at the termination of this agreement, together with all of the improvements, buildings, concessions, animals, birds, reptiles, fish, and grounds then in existence and hereinabove described and not otherwise disposed of as herein provided.
- (b) In the event this agreement is terminated before the full term has expired, the rights, title, and interest of the SOCIETY in all assets acquired by purchase or donation under the terms of this agreement shall be given and conveyed to the CITY provided that the CITY assumes liability for any indebtedness incurred by the SOCIETY in acquiring such assets. All moneys then in the hands of the SOCIETY including reserves resulting from this agreement shall be deposited in a trust account with the City Treasurer to be devoted to purposes and uses consonant with the improvement and betterment of the ZOO after payment of debts and obligations incurred in the operation of the ZOO. City Council shall make expenditures from such account consistent with the purposes of the trust. The SOCIETY shall have the right to make recommendations to the City Council as to the specific purposes for which the trust funds should be used. The SOCIETY agrees to incur no indebtedness to extend beyond the term of this agreement or the agreement then in effect or incur indebtedness which contemplates renewal of this agreement or the agreement then in effect.
- (c) None of the receipts from this agreement shall ever be distributed to the members, officers or trustees of the SOCIETY, except as reasonable compensation for services directly rendered in the operation of the ZOO or for goods or materials actually furnished by the SOCIETY for use in the operation of the ZOO. The members, officers or trustees of the SOCIETY shall not receive compensation for their services as such, but only for regular and direct services rendered in connection with the operation of the ZOO which would reasonably be considered employment.

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- (d) No part of any net earnings from the operation of the ZOO shall inure to the benefit of any private individual or person. No substantial part of the revenue from the operations of the ZOO shall be used to carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation, nor shall the SOCIETY or any person use any of such revenue or SOCIETY personnel to participate (including publishing or distributing of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- (e) The SOCIETY shall comply with all applicable laws and ordinances pertaining to the operation of concessions and public contracts.
- (f) Sixty (60) days after written notice, either party may terminate this agreement for non-compliance by the other with any term or condition hereof. The Council of the CITY may terminate this agreement by at least sixty (60) days' written notice, if it decides after public hearing that the public interest will best be served by termination. In such event the CITY shall assume all outstanding obligations of the SOCIETY related to this agreement. In the event of termination of this agreement, SOCIETY agrees to transfer to CITY such title, right or interest in or to all assets, including physical properties, cash and receivables as it then owns for the benefit of or use at the ZOO.
- (g) By written notice of the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Parks, the CITY may require the SOCIETY to obtain and furnish the CITY proof of a fidelity bond for a maximum amount of not less than Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) per occurrence indemnifying the SOCIETY against loss from the infidelity, dishonesty or default of any officer, agent or employe of the SOCIETY who has or may exercise control over money or other property belonging to or held by the SOCIETY or CITY.
- (h) On or before June 30, 1972, upon written request of either party, representatives of the CITY and of the SOCIETY shall meet together at a mutually convenient time or times to review the terms of this Agreement and renegotiate any terms thereof that either party may desire to have amended or modified at that time.
- (i) That in consideration of the SOCIETY'S management and operation of CITY'S ZOO, the CITY will include in the CITY budget and will pay to the SOCIETY for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1971, for ZOO purposes the sum of Three Hundred Fifty-four Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-one and no/100 Dollars (\$354,471), and the same amount each succeeding year during the term of this agreement or as extended, which amount, when established and approved according to law, shall be paid to the SOCIETY in equal monthly installments, payable in advance of each month, or in

Page 8 - Agreement June 3, 1971 EB:w - MCR:pm such other manner as may be mutually agreed, to be used exclusively for the operation, maintenance, and development of the ZOO as herein provided.

- (j) There has heretofore been set aside a fund for construction of a seal pond, being known as the City Improvement Fund. Said Fund shall be made available to and used by SOCIETY for such purpose after approval by CITY of plans therefor.
- (k) This agreement is intended to replace the agreements (Contract No. 126036 of April 24, 1968, and Contract No. 11707 of June 30, 1966) previously entered into by the parties hereto, and said previous agreements, as amended from time to time, shall terminate July 1, 1971.
- 5. This agreement shall become effective July 1, 1971, and shall continue in full force and effect to and including June 30, 1974, and shall automatically renew for a period of three (3) years unless reopened for negotiation by either party not more than ninety (90) nor less than sixty (60) days prior to June 30, 1974.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the SOCIETY has caused this agreement to be executed in triplicate by its duly authorized representative, and CITY has caused the same to be executed in triplicate by its Mayor and its Commissioner of Public Affairs, all on the day and year first above written and pursuant to Ordinance No.





ORDINANCE No. 132821

An Ordinance authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Portland Zoological Society for management of the Portland Zoo.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that the Portland Zoc Jgical Society has operated concessions and raised donations to assist the City in its operation of the Zoo; that its fundraising will be furthered and the operation of the Zoo for the benefit of the people of Portland may be improved by contracting with said Society for the full management of the Zoo of the City whereby the City will retain the right to approve the general policies of such management without increases during the term of the contract in City expenditures; now, therefore, the Mayor and the Commissioner of Public Affairs on behalf of the City hereby are authorized to execute an agreement with the Portland Zoological Society, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Oregon, 4001 S. W. Canyon Road, Portland, Oregon 97221, for the full management of the Portland Zoological Gardens, said agreement to be substantially in accordance with the form of agreement attached to the original only of this ordinance, marked Exhibit "1," and by this reference made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.
